

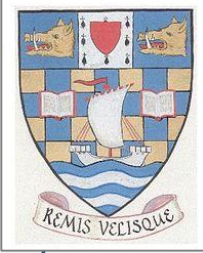

What is an infographic?

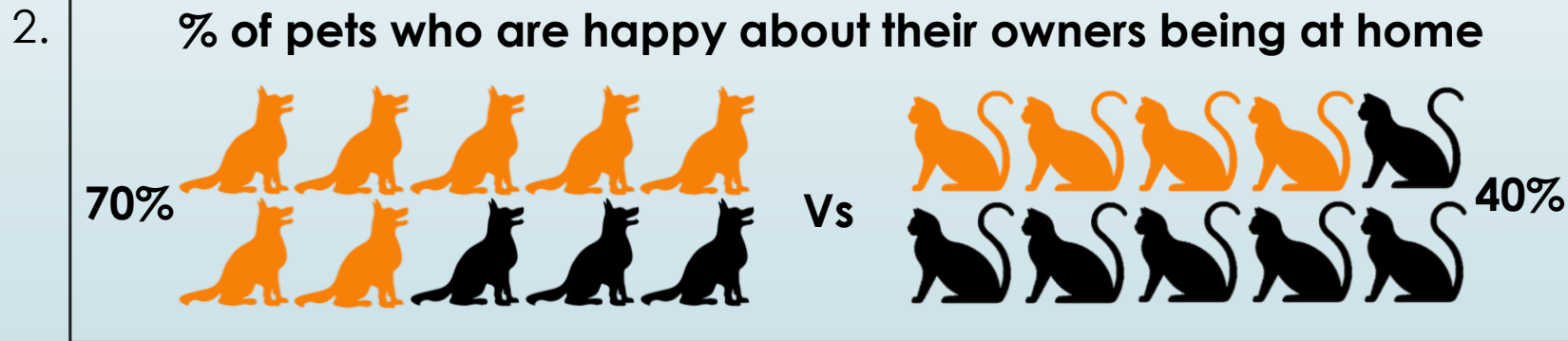

- It's a digital representation of data and information.

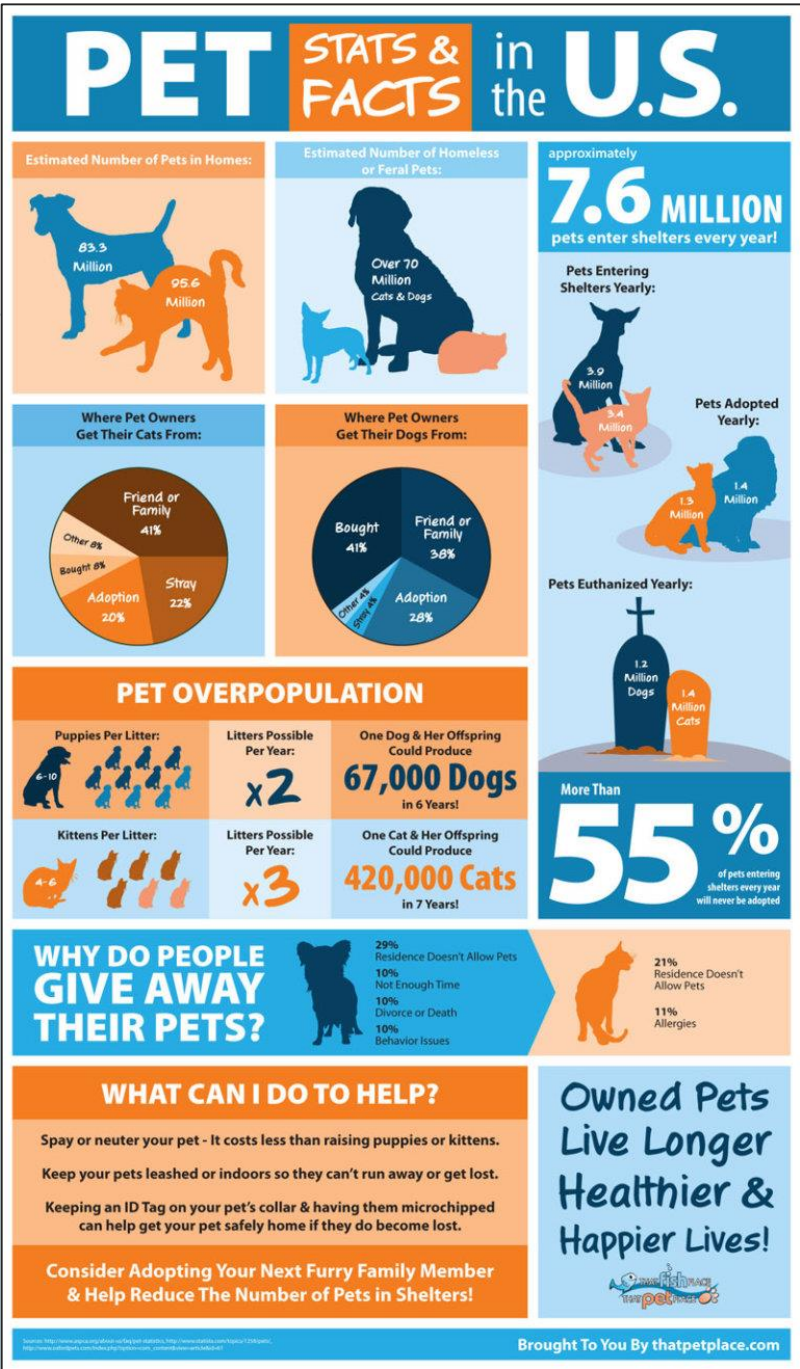
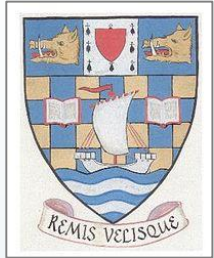

Simple is better



Information overload



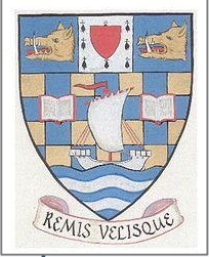
Although the infographic on the right looks impressive, its trying to do too much at once. This would be better as 3 or 4 separate infographics.

Infographics are meant to be quick to read and should give key information quickly.

When I look at it all I see is some maps, McDonalds and Starbucks, and I'm not sure what its telling me.

Compare this to the one on the left. Its clear it's about teachers, and the information is telling me: the % who are female, how many kids they teach on average and what age they are and what kind of degree they have.

TASK



- You are to design an infographic based on apps.
- It should be bright and eye catching
- There should be a good use of images, but limited use of text

 - Remember most Microsoft programmes (word, publisher, powerpoint etc) let you make graphs and charts

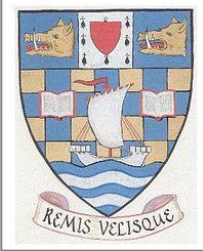

DATA



- In 2016, apps were worth \$88 billion—this number is projected to pass \$188 billion in 2020. A 113 percent increase over four years
- Nearly 25 percent (24.9%) of all available apps are game apps—2.5 times the number of business apps which has the second highest % at 9.8%
- Only 65% of mobile users have 1 or more game apps
- 97.5% have web browsers, 96.9% have communication and social apps and 91.2% have shopping apps.
- Users spend 20% of app time on social media, compared to 18% on music apps and 10% on multimedia and 10% on games.
