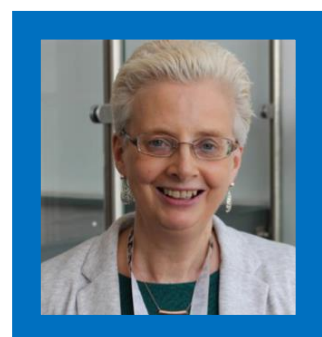

Firstly, we would like to reassure you that the transition process for your child is already well underway.

We have already had successful transition visits earlier in the academic year as well as an Open Evening and an opportunity for pupils and parents to visit the school and meet some of our staff.

In many cases the transition to secondary school takes place over the course of Primary 7. Some pupils requiring a little extra support have visited the school as part of their Enhanced Transition Programme, while Mrs Cormack, our Principal Teacher of Support for Learning has liaised with our Primary colleagues to gather information about the learning needs of pupils.

Given the current circumstances, the remainder of the Transition Plan for 2020 is likely to look quite different, however we will continue to work very closely with our Primary colleagues to ensure that we gather all the information that we will need to ensure that your child has a positive transition to secondary school.

Over the next few pages we will outline the steps that we will be taking to support your child at this time.

INFORMATION GATHERING

Mr McLean, Mr McFadden and Mrs Cormack will continue to gather vital information from your child's Primary School in relation to their attainment profile, their strengths and interests, their learning needs as well as any other important information that we will need to prepare for their arrival at St Columba's in S1.

As part of these discussions we will begin to compile a profile of information for each pupil and the most effective ways to support them.



ASSIGNING CLASSES

Pupils may be concerned about what classes they will be in when they move to St Columba's and whether they will be in classes with their friendship groups.

As in previous years, we will work in partnership with Primary staff to ensure that we can do everything possible to enable each pupil is placed in a class with people that they get on with and work well with.

INDUCTION DAYS

Traditionally, formal induction days are an important part of the transition process.

This year, it is looking increasingly unlikely that we will be able to run induction days in the traditional manner.

With this in mind we have a number of plans in development to find new ways of introducing pupils to staff and to their new school environment. This will include video tours, online questionnaires and information from subject departments.



VIRTUAL TRANSITION
