

# Assessment in St. Mary's Primary

## Information for Parents

If a child's needs are to be met effectively, then regular and reliable information about their attainment and abilities is necessary. We continually use assessment information to:

- monitor where each child is in their learning
- · track the attainment of all cohorts
- ensure pupils are working at appropriate levels
- · provide appropriate pace and challenge
- identify pupils with additional support needs

#### Formative Assessment involves:

- sharing learning intentions and success criteria
- · quality feedback from both teachers and other pupils
- · ongoing review and reflection of progress being made

It can be done through observation, marking of ongoing work and discussion on a daily basis.

#### Summative Assessment involves:

- A planned assessment at the end of a block of learning to assess progress and understanding
- An assessment carried out as written, oral, a performance or a project marked against a set criteria

### Assessments carried out in St. Mary's Primary:

 Holistic writing assessments- we assess children's progress in writing against a set criteria matched to national benchmarks. This is carried out by taking all literacy work and assessing consistency rather than a one off "test".

- End of block numeracy assessments— at the end of every topic in numeracy we carry out a short assessment to track knowledge and understanding and keep a record used towards teacher professional judgements.
- Accelerated reader online assessments— three times per year all pupils in P4-7 complete an online reading assessment which tracks word reading and comprehension. It gives pupil a ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development) which is a level to provide the correct level of challenge to choose books and a Reading Age. This allow pupils to know exactly where they are, understand their progress and challenge themselves.
- Ongoing phonic assessments— in Primary I-3 we assess pupils' knowledge and retention of sounds/spelling rules they have learned on an ongoing basis. We use this to target any gaps and move at the correct pace which challenges pupils.
- SNSA- Primary I, 4 and 7 pupils are assessed in term 3 using the Scottish National Standardised Assessments. This gives us an overview of where our children are against national benchmarks, in their class and against the national average.
- Numeracy Staging Posts- all pupils are assessed using Inverclyde standardised assessments in May/June to assess achievement and retention of outcomes taught at their stage.
- IDL assessments- In August all pupils in P3-7 carry out a single word reading and spelling assessment. For anyone who achieves below their chronological age we support through a computer based programme at the correct level in reading and spelling. We assess and track those pupils twice more through the year.
- All teachers will also use their own ongoing assessments to ensure pupils are always being challenged at the correct level.
