Here is a reminder:

My vision is that Wemyss Bay Primary School and Nursery Class will be the heartbeat of the community, where all are welcomed, nurtured, supported and challenged to achieve their potential, and become curious, creative, confident citizens, through irresistible learning experiences.

This week, I would like to explore how we develop our children to become curious, creative, confident citizens – essentially, our curriculum.

If we are going to get it right for every child and achieve the above, we need to offer a bespoke curriculum that nurtures the skills that in turn unleash potential. We need to ensure that our children know *how* to learn with a focus on metacognition, consciously and intentionally planning for the development of skills as well as knowledge. This is essential in order to equip our children for life in an increasingly complex and interconnected world: we all need skills that cross national and cultural borders.

So how do we achieve this?

Increasingly skilled and effective pedagogy, application of learning in real life contexts and raising the level of pupil participation and leadership, are all part of our strategy. These approaches will help us to develop a strong, high quality, universal curriculum offer that will benefit our while learning community.

Road Safety

We continue to experience huge challenges in keeping our children safe, particularly at the end of the day, due to the volume of traffic and inconsiderately parked vehicles in the vicinity of the school, including actually on the crossing area on more than one occasion. As you will appreciate, this is impacting on visibility and causing children to take unnecessary risks by emerging to cross roads between parked cars. Concerns have been raised via the Parent Partnership and we are committed to improving this situation. We would once again ask you to carefully consider where you choose to park please, to ensure we are more confident in our abilities to safeguard our children and families in this regard. Thank you.

Schools Travel Plan Project

As indicated in the previous newsletter, Inverclyde Council is currently exploring how sustainable travel can be enhanced and promoted in the most effective way. As part of this exercise, site visits will be carried out in order to actively investigate the existing situation around schools and other relevant data will be collected and collated including accident statistics and photographic evidence. Health and Wellbeing Matters...

Our Health and Wellbeing Matters continues to focus on the **Five Ways to Wellbeing**.

Evidence suggests there are five steps you can take to help improve your mental health and wellbeing.

These are

- connect
- be active
- take notice
- keep learning
- give



This issue focuses on the final step: **give**.

Acts of giving and kindness towards others can improve our wellbeing by creating positive feelings and a sense of reward, giving us a feeling of purpose and self-worth and helping us connect with people around us. The acts of kindness can be big or small, all that matters is that we feel connected to the act and the person or people it helps.

Participation in social and community life has attracted a lot of attention in the field of wellbeing research. Individuals who report a greater interest in helping others are more likely to rate themselves as happy.

Here are some suggestions to help you 'give' to others - and yourself:

- Allocate time in your week to check in with someone who lives alone or is struggling.
- Offer your skills or advice to someone who needs help with a project.
- Share what is working well in your home, with your job or with your children with others that may need support.
- Check out your local volunteering service to offer your time to help others.
- Raise money or awareness with your family and close friends for a specific charity or awareness event.
- Do something nice for a friend or stranger via random acts of kindness.
- Donate unwanted clutter to a Charity Shop.
- Smile – this opens conversations and connects you to others.
- Thank someone – we all like to be appreciated.
- Join a community group that helps others.

Research into actions for promoting happiness has shown that committing an act of kindness once a week over a six-week period is associated with an increase in wellbeing – so it must be a good thing!

We are quickly moving towards the end of term and the children are already getting excited for the big day in just a month's time. There is still a lot to do, however and we are very busy in the nursery.

Keeping in Touch: Learning Profiles, Doodle Books and phone calls

On Friday 26th November your child will come home with their learning profile folder and a Doodle book in a bag. All information is detailed in a separate letter and within the book itself. Please look over everything, sign and make comments. We really appreciate your feedback and ask that you return them on Monday 29th November in the same bag. We are also planning to make keyworker calls the week beginning 6th December. This is usually done after 3pm however, if this does not suit please arrange a time with your child's keyworker.

Lunchtime in the Nursery

We have moved to the canteen for lunch this week, and so far, it is going well. This is a great way to help with school transitions, allowing the children to become familiar with school settings and meeting the catering staff. Please continue to consider how much food is in your child's packed lunch (we promise they won't go hungry!), and remember too, that we are a healthy eating school and so ask that you limit - or even refrain - from sweets and juice, and of course, anything with nuts. Thank you.

Christmas

The children have decided to make calendars and hot chocolate cones this year for the Christmas Cracker enterprise. Order forms have already been issued – please return them with the appropriate monies, and by Friday 3rd December. We have also been practising our songs and have been choosing our costumes for the Nativity – great fun! The children are excited to be decorating the nursery and in the spirit of being eco friendly, we are asking if you have any old decorations that you may not be using, spare wrapping paper or cardboard boxes. If so, please hand them in to your child's keyworker. Thank you.

We have a collection of water bottles with no names on them. If you have lost a bottle then speak to your child's keyworker and we will see if we can identify it. Please remember to label all bottles. Thank you.
