
Hello Primary 5!

I hope you are well and enjoyed your Easter break!




<p>Focus: Reading for enjoyment</p> <p>Building up our reading stamina is important, we are working to try reading uninterrupted for a period of time. During this you should be using all your reading strategies to support your understanding of the text.</p> <p>Task: Having read a bit of a book of your choosing, explain to an adult what it was about in your own words (summarise). You can then predict what you think will happen next!</p> <p>Giglets: Next week an additional reading task will be set of Giglets. This is a new website for us, so if you can this week I'd like you to try logging on and have a look about. I'll email you with your log in and instructions!</p> <p>Free audiobooks: https://www.audible.co.uk/cat/Children-Audiobooks</p>	<p>Focus: Descriptions</p> <p>Using descriptions in our writing helps the reader to understand what is going on and adds interest. In this writing task think about describing the senses (see, hear, smell, touch, taste).</p> <p>Title: Behind the door</p>  <p>Write a descriptive story about a character opening this door and finding out what is behind. Is it magical? Is there a strange world through the door? Will your character meet someone? What can the character see? Smell? Hear? Do they touch or taste anything?</p> <p>When you are finished remember to read over and check your work! www.dictionary.com is a great website if you don't have a dictionary at home!</p> <p>I'd love to see what you write, take a picture or type your story up so you can send it to me!</p>	<p>Handwriting focus: sh</p>  <p>Practise the 'sh' join. Write the join in your jotter remembering to use finger spaces. Then write as many 'sh' words as you can think of! Don't forget the imaginary middle line!</p> <p>Spelling Pick one of the phonemes (or common words lists) from your home learning pack to revise using active spelling activities.</p> <p>Why not stretch your learning and find more words with the same phoneme and then write a silly story using the words?</p>
