Please revise the following:

Sounds	h, w, j, v, y, z Can you: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Say the sound?• Write the sound? (playdough, chalk, in sand, paint it, rainbow writing)• Make words with the sounds?• Recognise and write the capital letters.

- Story sequencing - cut out, colour and sequence the story. *
- Retell the story to an adult or your teddies in your own words - the pictures could help.
- Pick a character and circle words that describe them. Now write a sentence about them.*
- Write about the story in short sentences. How many sentences can you write? Use the word mat to help. *

Encourage your child to check that they have a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop at the end of each sentence. Ask them to sound out their words and spell their common words.

- Discuss with your child the difference between fact and fiction.

<p>Focus this week: Counting the Number of Jumps <u>Forwards</u> from a to b: <i>How many jumps from 6 to 8? Seven, eight-two jumps.</i> Now you can count the jumps from 4 to 6. New topic: Inside and Out


