It is also below...</p>	<p>Primary 3 We are moving onto multiplying three digit numbers by one digit which uses the same method, there is just an extra column in the sum. We haven't looked at carrying numbers yet, this will come next week. Science experiment Wibbly Wobbly!

For this experiment you will need:

A block of jelly cut into cubes (straight from the packet, not dissolved) •

2 chop sticks or pencils •

A small amount of cooking oil •

2 small bowls

Method: • Put the jelly cubes into one of the bowls. • Using the chopsticks or pencils transfer the jelly cubes to the second bowl.

Add the cooking oil to the jelly cubes.

Move the jelly cubes back into the first bowl, using the chop sticks or pencils. No Cheating!!
