Class News

2! This is a very busy term for us at
Whinhill and we are going to have lots
of fun over the next few months. We
will be learning all about Halloween,
Remembrance Day and of course
Christmas! We will be organising and
running the Christmas Market this term
as part of our enterprising topic and
will develop lots of Meta-Skills along
the way!

Health and Wellbeing

This term we are focusing on the wellbeing indicators of Healthy, Achieving and Nurtured. We will be looking at healthy lifestyles and balanced diets. We will also be exploring different types of relationships and friendships and how to create and maintain these, using the PATHs

<u>Literacy</u>

We are focusing on functional writing, and will be creating instructions, recounts, reports and letters across various contexts and themes. We are continuing to reinforce spelling rules and uplevel vocabulary, connectives, openers and punctuation to increase the maturity of our writing. Our reading groups are building skills of questioning to further understand a text, discussing theme, characters and writer's craft. By the end of Term 2, P7 will be able to take notes and present to the class using appropriate expression, volume and tone of voice, engaging their audience.

Numeracy

P7 are developing their confidence and competence in strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We have daily number talks to reinforce these strategies to solve calculations, including those involving decimal numbers. In our beyond number learning, the pupils are focusing on money, budgeting, profit and loss, and will go on to the context of time in the latter part of the term, reading the time on 12 and 24 hour clocks and solving real life problems.



<u>PE</u>

Our PE days are Thursday and Friday and our learning will be around Possession Games, with a focus on Netball and Basketball. Through this, we are developing our teamwork, communication and hand-eye coordination and balance. Pupils are reminded that jewellery should be removed, and fake nails are not permitted.

Other Curricular Areas

Topic

P7 will be leading and organising the school Christmas market, building their business minds, teamwork and financial skills.

Science

In science, Miss Ward will be teaching us all about the solar system and making electrical circuits.

Languages

In addition to reinforcing our previous learning and conversational language, we will be focusing on classroom objects and instructions. We will also be continuing to take part in weekly online Gaelic lessons with e-Sgoil.

Expressive Arts

P7 will be using a variety of media to create different pieces of seasonal art, focusing on line, colour, tone and texture. They will also be crafting cards, salt dough ornaments and jewellery for their Christmas market. In music, we will have a focus on the glockenspiel and will be preparing to sing at our annual Christmas

Homework

Spelling and Numeracy – All homework will be given out on a Monday and collected on a Thursday'

Reading — This will be given out on a Thursday and will be due the following Thursday. Pupils are asked to come prepared with questions for their reading group, to develop understanding of the text as well as dialogic skills.
