### Flu Immunisations

Message from the School Health Team (at Forres Health Centre) Flu vaccine will be offered to every primary school-aged child in Scotland this year. The vaccine will help protect your child against flu this winter and also prevent the spread of flu virus in the immediate family and community. Information leaflets and consent forms will be issued in September for immunisations to be offered on Wednesday 18th/Thursday 19th Nov. When you receive the pack please return completed consent form to school within 7 days.
