### **Staffing**

After an unsettled year with many staffing difficulties, August is looking to be more positive. We have only a few changes taking place. At the end of term we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Burgess who has been working in the school office at Applegrove for over 28 years! Mrs Lyall will be moving to a teaching post at Gordonstoun Junior School. I'm sure you will join me in wishing them both well as they move on and thank them for all the work they have done at Applegrove.

We welcome Mrs Millar in August as a Support for Learning teacher. Mrs McIntosh's Maternity post for Support for Learning will be re-advertised in August.

#### **New Classes**

We have enrolled a significant number of new children over the last few weeks. Many are at the same stage and this has made a big difference to how it may be possible to organise classes for August. There will be eleven classes again next year. For your information, classes are organised following Moray Council's policy on the structure of primary classes. Classes take into account the number of reading groups and which children have been in a composite (two different age groups) this year. If a class is made up of two age groups, only 25 children can be placed in that class. Otherwise P4-7 classes can rise to 33. When using reading groups, we have to add up the number of children to keep within these numbers. It is not the case for example, that a P3 child in P3/4 class is a good reader while the P4 is poorer. This is simply a case of making sure that children have the best possible support by making fewer groups in a class. In this way, the teacher can spend more time with each group. As reading is a skill on which so many other areas of the curriculum rely, it is important to take the opportunity to provide all the support we can.

Classes cannot be arranged around friendship groups. Every child visited their new classroom yesterday and you should have received a flier which states their teacher's name, room number and which entry door they will use in August.

Many of you completed a survey for us, in fact we received 103 feedback forms. This highlighted to us that 35 of you found these sessions to be helpful and 60 of you thought they were very helpful. Some of you said you would like chairs to be provided in the classrooms. Unfortunately we would not be able to do this unless we limited the number of parents who were allowed to attend due to the available space in the classrooms. Answers have shown us that some of you would particularly like to see a maths lesson, art based activities, computer lessons or how teachers organise outdoor learning. We will look to arranging this next school year.

Children are still working on the self-evaluation parts of these in some classes. These will all be sent home to you before the end of term, as each class is ready.
