

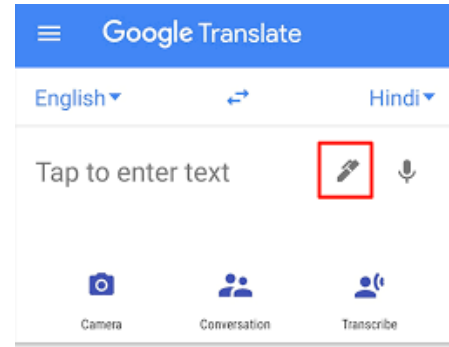

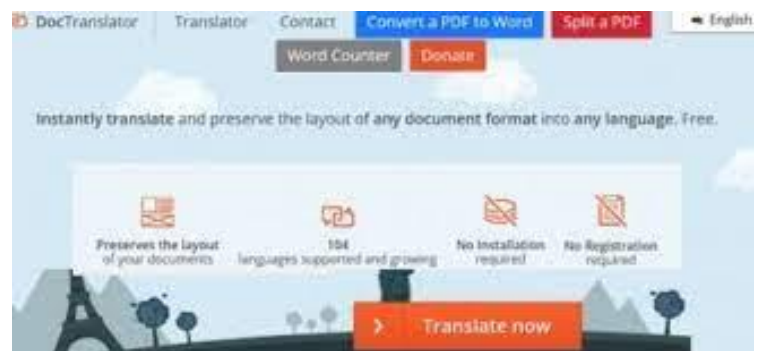

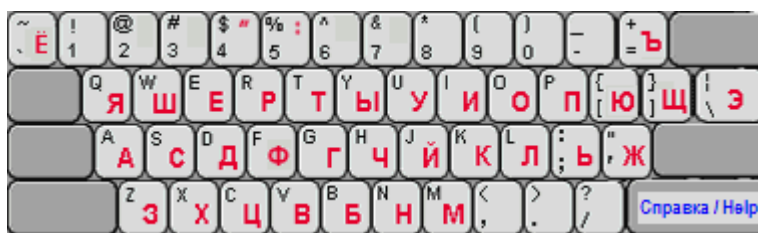

How to change the language of the PC or laptop in settings

1. Click the magnifying glass (Search) in the bottom left of the screen (if you don't have a magnifying glass visible, click on the start menu and scroll down to "Search");
2. Search for "Language settings";
3. Click on "Language Settings";
4. In the Language tab, click on "Add a language";
5. Search for Ukrainian, and select it;
6. Click "Next", then "Install";
7. In the Taskbar, bottom right corner of the screen, click on "ENG" and select Ukrainian from the options. You can swap back and forth between the languages using either this method or by pressing the windows button on the keyboard (bottom line between "fn" and "alt") and the space bar together.
