STEM - Make your own 3D constellations.

1. Watch the video about stars. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zdspyrd

A constellation is a group of stars forming a recognisable pattern.

The constellations that we know are patterns of stars in the sky, often shaped like animals or characters from legends. These patterns are extremely useful for learning your way around the sky.

- 2. Make your own 3D constellations by connecting the stars. You can also use marshmallows and toothpicks to make edible constellations.
- * Challenge* Why not have a go at making your own constellation and giving it a name!

 Can you create your own constellation story, describing how it came to be in the sky?

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Spelling rules

Practise the following spelling rules: Suffixing rules -

- nouns adding s to form the plural
- verbs adding ing to show the present tense
- verbs adding ed to show the past tense
- Select words from a book or poem you are reading, see if you can change them by adding the suffixes.

Use some of the active spelling strategies you would use in class. Eg, writing out in different colours, pyramid writing, write sentences using as many of your spelling words as possible.
