

## Transitions

We are well into our transition activities for our learners, helping to make sure they feel confident and supported as they prepare for their next steps.



Our **new Primary 1 starters** have already been visiting the classroom, joining in with playful learning sessions and story times, and getting to know their future classmates and teachers. These visits will continue next term, with a focus on building relationships and helping the children feel ready and excited for the year ahead.



At the other end of the school, our **Primary 7 pupils** are getting ready for their move to Secondary 1. As part of the rural schools transition programme, those going to Keith Grammar School been invited to join the *Keith Loft Youth Project*, which offers fun and meaningful opportunities to build confidence and connect with others. Both Keith Grammar School and The Gordons School offer information evenings and transition days for children to take part in. These days are designed to help them get a feel for life at secondary school – from following timetables and finding their way around, to travelling to and from school independently.

Transitions are such an important part of the school journey, and we're committed to making them as positive and reassuring as possible for all our learners.

Taking a few minutes each week to talk to your child about their learning – whether it's something they've enjoyed, found tricky, or are proud of – shows them that you're interested, helps them reflect, and strengthens that important home-school connection.

We're really grateful to families who regularly chat about learning and take time to sign the learning logs – it really does make a difference.



Annual reports have now been completed and will be sent home shortly. Parent meeting appointments will be arranged for the beginning of Term 4, offering another chance to speak directly with your child's class teacher about their progress and next steps.
