Outdoor Learning

Last term was filled with adventure, thanks to some brilliant outdoor learning sessions! We enjoyed fantastic experiences with Angie, as well as superb sessions led by the rangers from the Dornell Windfarm Team.

The Dornell Windfarm rangers ran fascinating sessions both here at school and out near the Acorn Centre at the Cabrach. They shared their expertise on two important local species: sphagnum moss and our magnificent golden eagles.





The children learned all about the crucial work being done to protect these animals and their local habitats. It was a wonderful day where we tracked water, checked out the impressive size of a Golden Eagle's wingspan, and enjoyed fun, hands-on science lessons—like learning about bird beak adaptations and food chains!





Angie focused on developing great teamwork and leadership skills while exploring our outdoor environment. The children tackled a huge variety of activities, including:

- Outdoor Maths (measuring trees)
- Cooking (savoury and sweet dough!)
- Creative Art projects
- Engaging Team Building and leadership games
- And lots of fun with local nature and animals.

Learning at Home

To help reinforce your child's learning, we encourage you to use the information in our class newsletters and weekly learning logs as a starting point for conversations at home.

Talking to your child about what they are learning is incredibly powerful. Here are some simple questions to help get the dialogue started:

- "What was the most interesting thing you learned this week?"
- "Can you teach me something new from your Learning Log?"
- "How did you use [Maths/Literacy] this week?"
- "What are you most proud of achieving this week?"

Your child can use their school logins to practice key skills at home. This is a great way to reinforce classroom lessons:

- They can practice their numeracy and maths skills on Sumdog.
- They can work on their weekly spelling lists using Spelling Shed.





If your child is currently learning phonics, they will be bringing home **phonics books** to practice the sounds they are working on, and they will transition to using Spelling Shed for their spellings at a later stage.

Remember, **reading for fun** has an amazing, positive impact on all areas of learning!
You can make a big difference by encouraging and sharing different types of reading at home—it doesn't just have to be a novel! Try exploring:

- Bedtime stories or audiobooks
- Reading a recipe together
- Comic books or magazines
- Fun visual books like "Where's Wally" or optical illusion books

Adverse Weather



As we prepare for winter and the potential weather challenges it may bring, we wanted to share important information about how severe weather could impact school transport and the steps we'll take to manage these unpredictable circumstances.

School closures are sometimes necessary at this time of year. We will make every effort to communicate closure decisions as promptly as possible through the following channels:

- Moray Council Service Disruption Webpage: Updates will be posted at https://secure.moray.gov.uk/mcalerts/portal.
- Moray Council Social Media: Posts will be shared on the Council's <u>Facebook page</u> and Twitter feed.
- Email Alert Service: Alerts will be sent to those registered at <u>mygovscot</u> who have selected Rothiemay Primary School for updates. (Please note, this service is separate from our regular school emails.)

If severe weather requires us to send bus pupils home early, we will attempt to call parents to inform them, ensuring someone is available at home to meet the child off the bus. Please be aware that we don't control the arrival times of the buses, so there may be a delay between our call and the bus arriving at your home.

Weather and road conditions can vary greatly from one area to another. We encourage you to use your own judgement to decide whether it is safe for your child to travel to school. If you feel that local conditions pose a risk, please make the best decision for your family's safety.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we navigate the winter season together.
