Looking Ahead

This term, the P6/7 pupils will be busy rehearsing for an exciting Scottish Opera performance, learning a range of songs in preparation for performing alongside pupils from our local primary schools. This is a fantastic opportunity for our learners, supporting transition to the next stage, building performance skills and confidence, and giving them the chance to meet pupils from other local schools while working collaboratively as part of a larger production. Further information will be sent to parents and carers regarding the performance, which will take place on Wednesday 11th March 2026 (afternoon) at Keith Primary School.



We are also thrilled to continue our partnership with Amanda Walker, Active Schools Coordinator for Keith ASG. Amanda has already been in touch to arrange some lunchtime sessions for the children as well as sessions to train up the older children to become young leaders where they will develop leadership skills to develop their own lunchtime sessions.



As part of our commitment to ensuring smooth and positive transitions, we will be holding transition meetings and organising visits to support pupils as they move between key stages. This includes supporting our nursery children as they transition into Primary 1, as well as our Primary 7 pupils as they prepare for their move to Secondary 1. In our small school setting, children are already familiar with staff and often see their next teacher around the school. We further support these transitions through planned visits to their next class during the final summer term, helping pupils feel confident, secure and well prepared for the next stage of their learning.

To get a closer look at the day-to-day magic, please remember to check your child's Learning Log every Friday. Together, the newsletter and the log provide a clear window into your child's week and their overall learning journey.

Chatting about school at home is one of the simplest ways to boost a child's confidence and reinforce what they've learned. We encourage you to use these updates as a weekly springboard for conversation.

- *What was the most interesting thing you learned today?*
- *Can you explain that idea to me in your own words?*
- *Did anything surprise you today? Why?*
- *How would you solve this problem differently next time?*

Thank you for your support and understanding. Every effort will be made to ensure that closure decisions are made in a timely manner. When a decision has been made it will be communicated in the following ways:

- Post on the Moray Council Service Disruption webpage. This will be visible to anyone who visits <https://secure.moray.gov.uk/mcalerts/portal> on the Council website.
- Post on the Moray Council Facebook page and Twitter feed (facebook.com/MorayCouncil / twitter.com/TheMorayCouncil)
- Send an Email Alert message. This message will only be received by those who have registered at [mygovscot](https://online.moray.gov.uk/site/wss/home) and chosen Rothiemay Primary School as services about which they wish to receive alerts. (Note - this is not connected to our regular Rothiemay school emails.)

If a decision is made for an early closure, pupils may need to be collected by parents, or buses will collect them earlier than usual. We'll try to contact parents so someone can be home, however exact bus timings cannot be guaranteed, as schedules may differ from the usual collection times.
