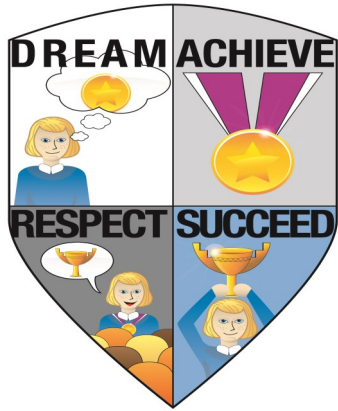


# Our School

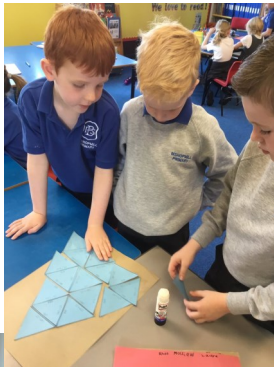
