## This is a Blackbird.



- Male Blackbirds are black and female blackbirds are brown.
- They eat worms.
- Blackbirds like to scratch around in autumn leaves.

# This is a Starling



- Starling are smaller than blackbirds, with a short tail, pointed head, triangular wings.
- It nests in a hole in a wall, tree or building.
- A Starling eats insects and seeds.

## This is a House Sparrow.



- A male House Sparrow has a black bib and face mask.
- The House Sparrow likes to live near people.
- Its chunky beak is good at cracking seeds open.

## This is a Blue Tit.



- Blue Tits eat caterpillars, nuts and seeds.
- You can find Blue Tits in trees, but rarely on the ground.
- They nest in holes in trees, including nest boxes.

# This is a Great Tit.



- The Great Tit is the largest European tit and it is about the size of a House Sparrow.
- They nest in holes in a tree or wall, or among the twigs of old nests.
- A Great Tit eats insects, such as caterpillars and spiders, seeds and berries.
- Listen to the sound a Great Tit makes

## This is a Chaffinch.



- The red front on a Chaffinch means that the bird is a boy.
- They live almost everywhere in the UK.
- A Chaffinch eats seeds but feeds it young insects.

# This is a Goldfinch.



- Goldfinches eat seeds and insects.
- In winter many UK Goldfinches migrate as far south as Spain.
- Their long fine becks help them with hard to reach seeds.

## This is a Greenfinch.



- Greenfinches are green with bright yellow flashes on their wings and tail.
- It nests in trees or bushes.
- A Greenfinch eats seeds, buds and berries.

## This is a Great Spotted Woodpecker.




- The woodpecker's tongue is extremely long and sticky for taking out insects, like ants, from their nest chambers.
- It nests in trees.
- A Great Spotted Woodpecker eats insects, seeds and nuts.

## This is a Collared Dove.



- A Collared Dove is small, slim dove with quite a long tail.
- It is much smaller than a Wood Pigeon.
- A Collared Dove eats seeds and grain.

# This is a Woodpigeon.



- A Woodpigeon is normally grey with a pinkish breast and green, white and purple patch on the neck.
- Their nest is made from twigs and is found in trees or on buildings.
- A Woodpigeon eats crops like cabbages, sprouts, peas and grain. They also eat buds, shoots, seeds, nuts and berries.


