You can't play tennis on wet grass, so when it rains it needs covering up. Teams of court coverers are ready to pull covers across as soon as any droplets of rain are felt.

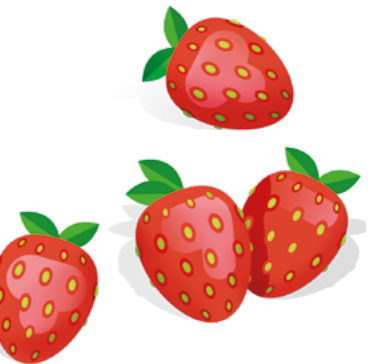

WHEELCHAIR MASTERS

Wheelchair tennis first came to Wimbledon in 2005. In 2019, Wimbledon held its first Quad Wheelchair championship event.

There is only one rule difference between wheelchair tennis and non-wheelchair tennis; wheelchair tennis players are allowed two bounces. The second bounce can be outside the court.



DID YOU KNOW?

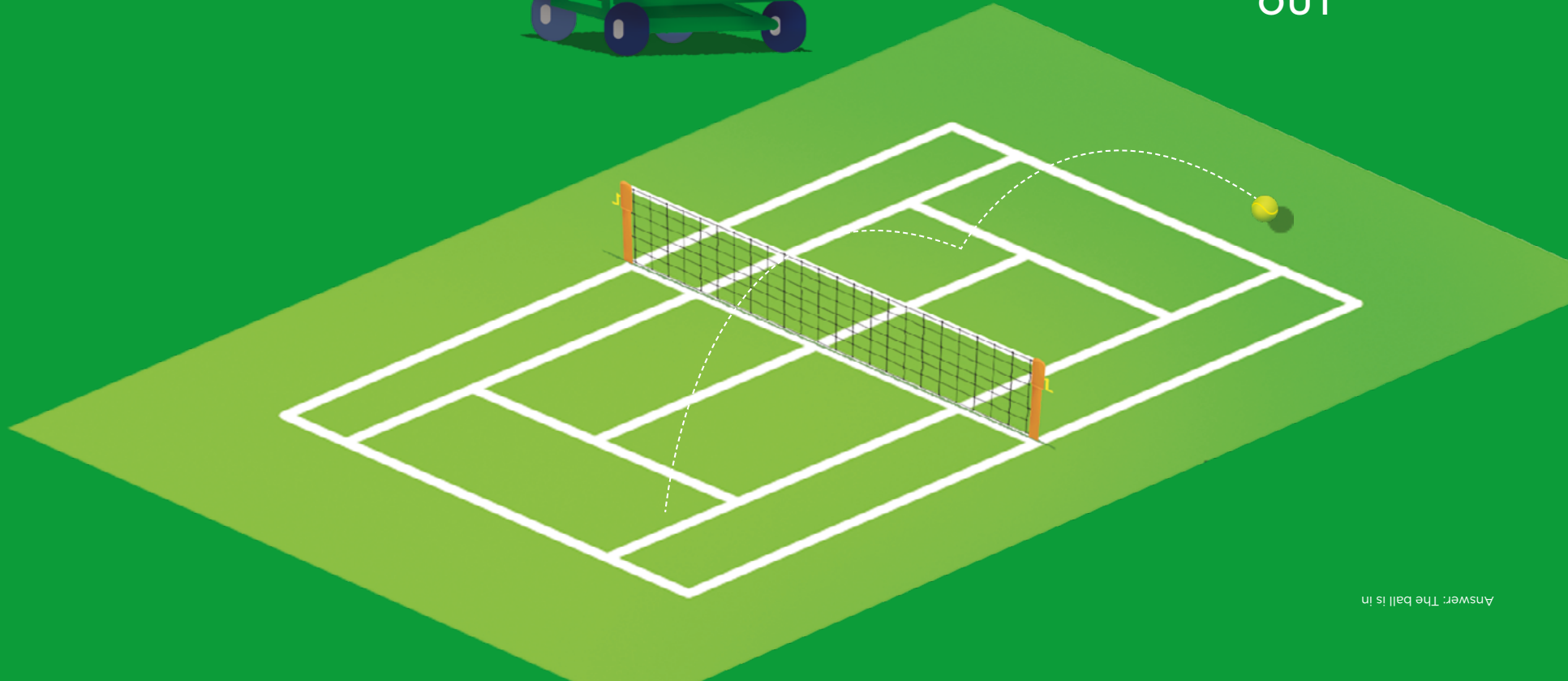
Four-time Wimbledon champion Jordanne Whiley made British history in 2015, after winning every Grand Slam in one calendar year.

THE TOP JOB

Behind every trophy won at The Championships, is an engraver.

They use traditional hand engraving tools to engrave the names on the trophies.

Carefully, engrave your name and add the missing fruit to the trophy.

Players such as Roger Federer and Serena Williams have won Wimbledon many times. Each time they win, they are presented with a special trophy but they don't get to take the trophy home with them!
