Dear Parents/Carers,

The Moray Council has a system for informing parents, staff and the general public when there are school or nursery closures. This is a Moray-wide system and if you register on-line, you will receive alerts regarding all sorts of Council services – not only school closures – depending on your preference. For school closures, the system will work as follows:

- 1. The decision to close the school is taken by the Head Teacher.
- 2. The Head Teacher will post details on the Moray Council portal. Options will be chosen to...
 - o Post on the **Moray Council Service Disruption webpage.** This will be visible to anyone who visits https://secure.moray.gov.uk/mcalerts/portal on the Council website.
 - Post on the Moray Council Facebook page and Twitter feed. Again, this will be visible to anyone who cares to look.
 - Send an Email Alert message. This message will only be received by those who have registered at mygovscot https://online.moray.gov.uk/site/wss/home and chosen Botriphnie Primary School as services about which they wish to receive alerts.
- 3. A message will also be posted on the THUS School Information Line, while this service is still available.
- 4. On receiving a closure alert email, or viewing closure information on-line, parents/carers should follow procedures overleaf. If the school is to be closed during the day then parents will be phoned with information on whether the school bus is running and/or collecting their children.

Please note:

- Alerts will not appear on the school website or Facebook page only those of the Moray Council.
- A text message will not be sent for closures outside school hours.
- The Council's system no longer informs **Moray Firth Radio**, automatically, so **broadcasts should no longer be relied upon** for up-to-date school closure information.

What to do, now:

- Go to mygovscot https://online.moray.gov.uk/site/wss/home, create your account and choose Botriphnie Primary School as services for which you would like to receive alerts
- Familiarise yourself with the procedures on the flowchart and ensure that you have emergency contacts or addresses in place, as necessary. Keep your flowchart in a safe place.
