chair, where we shared one of 'Poppy Scotland's' recommended stories for children. It was a very powerful picture book sharing

the journey of a child forced to become a refugee when war destroys everything she has ever known. It helped us all to think about children across the world as we explored Article 38- the right to protection in war. The children made a short video to showcase their learning.

I've managed to buy it on Audible and we look forward to starting it on Friday. Here's what Botriphnie's biggest Jacqueline Wilson fan (Lexi, P6) had to say...

"Today we took part in an author's live talk. The author was Jacqueline Wilson. I was super excited about this because I'm a superfan! I've read 'Hetty Feather', 'Candyfloss', 'Fortune Cookie' and 'Cliffhanger'. In my opinion, they are the greatest books ever. I've also watched the television series to match her books. Some are called 'The Beaker Girls', 'The dumping Ground', 'Tracey Beaker returns' and 'The Story of Tracey Beaker'. I have watched more but I can't list them all. Jacqueline Wilson has written and published a new book called 'Star of The Show'. Jacqueline Wilson inspires me to write books and novels. What was interesting about her is she started writing when she was nine...that's amazing!"

We wanted to thank our kind community neighbours for their support and recognised their commitment with an 'Over and Above' certificate for their commitment to our school value 'Community' and 'Creative.'

Some of our pupils were delighted to visit the Cabin as part of our community engagement focus. We were delighted with the 'Resilient Ruby' Mind-set on display. Jay, Erin and Charles took their roles very



seriously and worked hard to practise their books so they could be fluent, clear and engage the audience. Here's what they had to say on return...

"Today me, Charles and Erin went to The Cabin to read a book to the kids. I read 'Oh Dear!' by Rod Campbell. I was 4 in the pit because I read it myself and I was the teacher.

First, we went into different groups and the children would come if they wanted to read with us. I had five children to read with me. I did the reading in the shed. They listened to me because they wanted to hear the story. I had actions to match the story like slapping my head for 'oh dear' and they copied me. I read it with expression and I made sure they saw the pictures and they could lift the flaps.

Then we spoke to Donna, the manager, and she said we could come back again. I feel good. I think it was awesome. I nailed it! I am going to read a different book next time." Jay



"Today me and Charles and Jay, we went to The Cabin in Dufftown because we were reading to the little children. We are reading to them because they cannot read yet but we want them to get into reading. This will help us get gold for reading schools. I read 'Lost and Found' to my cousin and other children too. I practised reading the book so I could be good. I was expressing it quite a lot and I was quick at figuring out the words.

I think they liked it because they said, "Please read another story."
