

## Restart a Heart (RSAH) Live CPR Session

On Wednesday, October 1st, pupils participated in the Restart a Heart (RSAH) Live CPR Familiarisation Session. This engaging and interactive event introduced them to life-saving CPR techniques and the proper use of defibrillators. More than just learning vital skills, our pupils are now ready to share their newfound knowledge with their families, becoming ambassadors of life-saving action in the community.



## Bonfire Safety Visit



On Monday 27th October, we were delighted to welcome Stuart Mount, a Community Safety Advocate, to our school for an informative presentation on Bonfire Safety. We discovered that you need to be five years old to hold a sparkler and that sparklers can burn five times hotter than a BBQ! We also learned that you must be 18 years old to buy fireworks.

Stuart reminded us how important it is to think about animals during firework displays, as the loud noises, bright colours and smoke can cause them distress.

Through this session, we developed important safety awareness skills, including how to plan and enjoy bonfire celebrations responsibly, recognise potential hazards and make sensible decisions to keep

ourselves and others safe.



## Interdisciplinary Learning - Macduff Aquarium Visit



"Today Macduff Aquarium came to show us invertebrates (animals that don't have a backbone). They had starfish, different types of crabs and sea urchins. We also saw shark eggs, crab eggs and lobster shells.

We learned that starfish have eyes on the ends of their arms, one starfish had 13 eyes! The starfish also had little suckers. Its mouth and bottom are in the same place. We

learned that a sea urchin has a bottom on the top of it (where we thought the head was). A basking shark is 10m long. We watched a video of a lobster moulting and coming out of its shell that was too small for it."

together. Lots of 'Resilient Ruby' Mindsets were displayed when not even the rain could dampen their spirits!


## Achievement Assembly
