Staffing

A huge welcome to Miss Sam Howie who has been teaching instead of Miss Mackie on a Friday since the beginning of term and has quickly become a valued member of our school community. She has been covering a few areas of the curriculum that can be more stand-alone such as French, Music and Science and it is great

that the children have the opportunity to experience a different teacher every week.

Christmas

As we head through this winter term, our thoughts will turn to Christmas. Like last year, with guidelines still being in place in school, we have made an early decision that we will not be doing a formal Christmas show. The Christmas party will still go ahead (hopefully with a visit from the man in red) and we have some plans for a Christmas outing as well that we will share when we have some more information. The school Christmas lunch will be on Friday 3rd December.

Uniform

Now that we are more back to normal, we would like all pupils to return to school uniform. The uniform is not strict but it is good when all the

children look smart. The uniform is grey/black skirt or trousers, school sweatshirt and white shirt or white/black polo shirt. Sports/leisure trousers and jeans are not acceptable. Our exception to this is a Wednesday when children are to wear clothes appropriate for the Waste.

Shoes

As we are getting to the time of year when children will be coming to school with bigger shoes/boots, could we ask that children have indoor shoes that they can wear in the classroom and can be kept at school please? This will be more comfortable for your child and will mean we won't have to worry about muddy carpets as the weather takes a turn.

Waste Wednesday

The children thoroughly enjoy their time in the Waste and are also enjoying using the mud kitchen. We will continue using the waste even as the weather is turning colder and the ground can be quite wet. This means it will be even more important that the children are dressed appropriately, especially their footwear. If anyone has any old, but still in good condition, welly boots at home, we will happily take them to use as spares if children forget.

Lunchtime Club

To give a bit of an alternative to the Waste on a Wednesday, Mrs Stepien has been running a lunch time club indoors. The children can opt in and out of this club and it has proven to be very popular.

School Improvement Plan

Every year we decide as a staff what our school improvement priorities will be for the forthcoming year(s). With COVID, there has been more of a focus on the health and wellbeing of all our children. This year though we have created a new School Improvement Plan which will support

us in improving the outcomes for all our learners. Our priorities are:

- 1) Quality of Learning and Teaching
- 2) Raising attainment in Literacy
- 3) Raising attainment in Numeracy
- Recovery Curriculum including relationship policies and pupil participation

We will be working with staff in Rothiemay for many of these and Miss Mackie will be using her additional development time on a Friday to ensure that we get it right for all our children at Crossroads in our own, unique context. A full version is available from the school.

The weekly reflections will continue this term. We would really appreciate it if you could sign these to let us know that you have read them with your child. The children work hard on these on a Friday and they value conversations about their learning throughout the week.

Lateness and absences

Thank you for being so organised in the morning and reporting absences in good time. All absences must be reported to the school by 9:30am at the latest. As we do not always have an administrator (Mrs Jamieson is here on Tuesday and Thursday) if it is possible to email or use the parent portal, that would be great. During the current pandemic, we have to be even more careful with recording the reasons for children being absent. As part of our care for your children, we follow up any unexplained absence, which can take a lot of time and cause worry. If

your child is going to be late, please let the school know and let us know their lunch choice if they are school dinners as this has to be recorded by 9:30am. Thank you.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle to school every day. Your child will have access to this throughout their learning time to help hydrate their brain. It is therefore important that it is filled with plain tap water only. This can be refilled throughout the day from our water fountain.

Children may bring flavoured water or still juice for break or lunch but this should be in a different bottle/container to their class water bottle. Fizzy drinks and energy drinks are not permitted in school.
