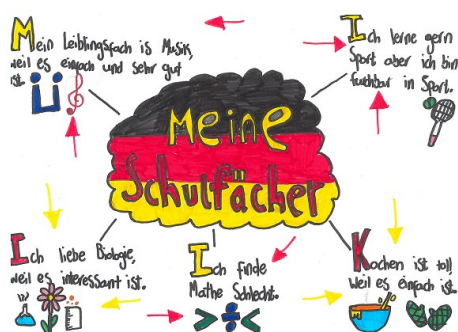
From Amanda Walker, Active Schools Coordinator (Keith ASG):
