## Health and Safety

### COVID Update

Since the relaxation of rules and an easing of guidance across Scotland alongside the return of schools it is not surprising that cases have started to climb. If you are keeping up to date with the news it is well reported that we are starting to see increasing cases.

The track and trace guidance has changed and there is now a self-contact trace process for you to carry out, should you have any symptoms. It is vital you help us keep our school safe by letting us know of any positive cases. This information will be kept confidential but will help us work with public health to inform others.

### Current Safety Measures

The changes to the safety measures we have in place have remained the same as they were before summer. The Scottish Government has advised that these will be reviewed later this term if not before, again it will depend on the scientific evidence to support any changes. I would ask for your continued support of these measures and reinforce this with your child(ren). We all hope things will change soon, but if we can hold on for that wee bit longer it will ensure we are all safe and schools will remain open for the whole year.

#### The current measures that will continue are:

- We **must adhere** to the social distancing guidance between staff and pupils.
- Face coverings **must be** worn in all indoor spaces where we are in the company of others. Face coverings can only be removed when outside and a safe distance from others.
- Lateral Flow Testing must continue as this is another measure that has proven to help identify cases more rapidly.
- Regular hand washing and routine application of sanitiser throughout the day.
- Following the one-way system.
- Staggered lunch break.

We are expecting further updates over the next few weeks and any changes will be shared with you as soon as they are confirmed.

### Lateral Flow Testing

This is optional for all pupils who wish to continue testing as part of the universal testing offer. Please note that testing should be carried out on a Sunday and Wednesday. If your child needs a replacement kit, these are available from the school hall Monday and Thursday lunchtimes. We have also started delivering test kits to BGE classes across the week to make sure they have enough supplies.



## COVID-19 Vaccinations

The COVID vaccination team have been in school to support the vaccination of our 16 or 17 year olds. It was encouraging to see many of our senior pupils have already had one or both doses which just demonstrates how responsible our young people are. Well done everyone for supporting our efforts to keep our school community safe!

## School Flu Immunisation Programme

We have received a letter from the Scottish Government about the plans to extend the flu immunisation programme to secondary school pupils this session. Public Health Scotland will provide a flu education pack with resources so that you have as much information as possible. The proposed date for the programme to start is the 27<sup>th</sup> September 2021. ## SQA Update

Last week the SQA set out the key detail on plans for assessment of National Qualifications in 2021-22. This follows confirmation from the Cabinet Secretary for Education that exams will be held for National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher courses this session.

The Cabinet Secretary has informed parliament that, *'The central planning assumption is that an examination diet for National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher courses will be held in session 2021-2022. This decision has been informed by the views of stakeholders, including the National Qualifications Group, and by public health advice.'*

SQA exams will take place from **26 April to 1 June 2022** with results day on **9 August 2022**.

Once more information is available we will share this with you as soon as we have it. It is clear that while planning for exams is a priority it clearly depends on any further impact of the COVID-19 pandemic across the school year, making our following the safety measures a crucial part of the process to successfully reach the exam diet.

## School Counselling
