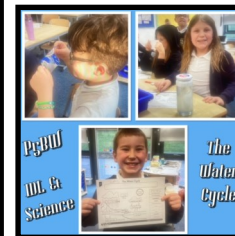
Interdisciplinary Learning

Here's a collage of P5BW learning about the water cycle with little science experiments to exemplify some of the parts of the process.

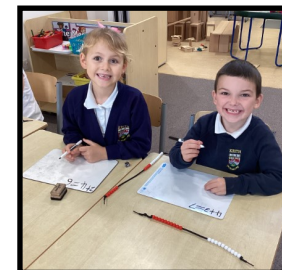


As part of P3D's class choice IDL they have been learning about space. Last week they looked at the size and order of the 8 planets. After ordering the planets, children had the chance to draw them.
