School Improvement

This term, we have been evaluating the impact of our school improvement work. Class teachers have been participating in learning walks across the school to track learner engagement and provide whole school feedback, supporting our school improvement cycle. Overall, we can see that our newly developed spelling pathway is raising attainment, with evidence demonstrating higher levels of engagement across the school, as well as improved opportunities for support and challenge. The approach builds on 'Emerging Literacy' and 'Talkboost Approach', embedded within P1 curriculum, focusing on four key areas: oral language, concept of print, phonological awareness and pre handwriting skills. As ever, there is more we can do to further improve the approach further and this will continue to be a focus for the rest of the session. Next, we intend to monitor writing jotters across the school to analyse how well children apply what they have been learning within weekly writing lessons.

Parent Council Meeting

I'm very much looking forward to our next Parent Council meeting as some of our pupils would like to present on initiatives they have been involved in leading. Pupils from P6/7 would like to share two things: the impact of pen license on pupil motivation and presentation and a health and wellbeing leadership role they would like to develop...Wellbeing Ambassadors. The meeting will have to be within the school day for pupils to be included. Usually we would offer a choice of date and time to ensure maximum attendance. However, we are restricted by timetables as Mrs Wright and Miss Inkson would also like to attend. Therefore, a date of Tuesday 29th March has been set at 10.00 for the meeting. A link will follow nearer the date.

Numeracy Support booklets

I've been delighted to hear that so many pupils have been setting themselves the challenge of working through their strategy books at home. We will definitely have more learners achieving an 'aspire' certificate at the end of this term. Time has also been available within Self Directed learning slots in P4/5 and P6/7 for children to consolidate numeracy concepts taught within term two. Mrs Mair has just finished the multiplication and division books at each level this week and we are in the process of copying them for next term. Mrs Jamieson is in the process of moving information to a new Glow website. We will make sure the support videos are included within the website for your use at home.

In P1/2/3 learners have been designing and constructing models, explaining their solutions as part of STEM lessons exploring forces. I was lucky enough to see our young engineers in action last week. They were most definitely displaying a 'Persevering Pete' attitude as they were constantly reviewing their structure and making predictions about how tall it would be, then testing for accuracy. It was wonderful to see learners so engaged and most definitely in 'flow'.
