Life and Work of School as a Community- Interactive Learning Pit #How we learn

Thank you to all families joining us for our Open Evening during the last week of term. It's always lovely to welcome family members into school to learn more about how we do things here at Newmill Primary, gaining a clearer picture of what daily life looks like for our wee people. We hope you enjoyed participating in the learning tasks on offer and feel in an even stronger position to support home learning as a result. It's great to hear (via questionnaire) that so many of our learners refer to learning ninjas out of school, confirming that they help promote learning attitudes which support wider achievement.

As part of our school improvement agenda we are introducing 'cold' and 'hot' assessments in writing. As always, the learners are fully involved in the process and are aware of the rationale behind changes. This ensures their voice can be heard as we measure impact. As we embark of a term focusing on learning to write reports, the children completed their 'cold' assessment this week, using only success criteria to guide them. The whole school wrote a report about Newmill Primary School. It was really interesting to read what our pupils had to say about our school. Almost all children included information about 'The Wall', 'Newmill's Learning Pit', Reading Schools, Rights Respecting Schools and our newest recruit, Rosie the Rights Rabbit, with a really strong understanding of our vision and values. All teachers were

impressed with the children's unsupported effort in terms of written content but also their strong knowledge and understanding of the school's ambitious vision, the journey we are on and their part in it. Here's some examples...

"Newmill have their own way of learning. They use their pit and wall. On the wall they have ninjas that prove you should always try and never give up. We aim to grow the four capacities everyday which are effective contributors, confident individuals, successful learners and responsible citizens." Molly, P7

"We also have the learning pit. It shows us how much understanding we have of different

"The school staff are important because they help the students learn. Many people like Newmill Primary School and their learning methods'. Lyla, P5

"At Newmill Primary, we take rights very seriously. Our rights are very important and once a week we have fun 31. Our rights are so important we have a new rabbit character to help us learn about them. Our school has two silver awards. I'll be interested to see how the 'hot' assessment compare when we use the same context to moderate value added as a result of the learning and teaching focus. As a staff team, we continue to make our way through the learning pit embedding the 'Explicitly Teaching Writing Approach' and maximising use of our newly purchased PM writing resources to up level our curriculum.

Life and work of the School as a Community- Scholastic book Fair Reading School Accreditation- Parental Support



We were delighted with the support for the Scholastic Book Fair earlier this month. We haven't worked our exact commission yet.

However, based on our school spend, we will have a significant amount to support purchase of up to date reading material. We must say a huge thank you to Mrs Stewart for organising and supporting the Book Fair. This will help make sure all learners have access to up to date reading material, relevant to their needs, interests and experiences. Looking ahead to Christmas, the children were able to identify authors and titles they would like to explore further via whole class novel study in term three, funded by Parent Council Christmas Gift. Pupil led selection and votes were key in selecting our novels. It was great to have the Book Fair in the school hall to discuss genres, authors and how to select books using the blurb, in

addition to, the front cover. All classes voted from a choice of three books following class sessions exploring options.
