

# Map and Binoculars

## Making the Binoculars



Start by decorating two empty tubes.



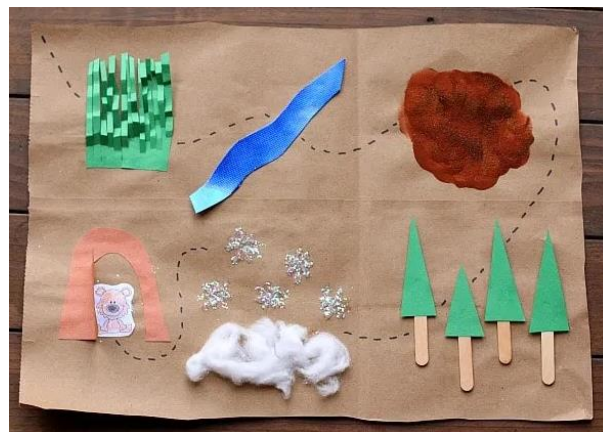
Glue or tape a small piece of card to each tube to form binoculars.



Make a small hole in either side of your binoculars. Ties a piece of string or wool through the holes and you are done.

## Making the Map

Make a map using things you have at home to help retell the story, fold the paper into six sections for each part of the journey. What could you use to be the long wavy grass, deep cold river, thick oozy mud, big dark forest, swirling whirling snowstorm and the narrow gloomy cave?
