P1-4

With Mrs Field, we have been finding out about the winter season including the weather and the different types of birds around our school. Next we will look the season of spring and the animals in our environment.

We are developing our number skills through multiplication and division activities. We have made a time machine so we can travel back in time. Our first stop was to find out about dinosaurs. We made fact cards about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores including answers to our question that we made. Our next stop will be in the Vikings.

Mrs Byrne has told us stories about Noah and the ark, and David and Goliath. We have been learning how to cook and taste different foods, fitness circuits in PE and how to tell the time.

P4-7

We have had a busy start to the term and our chosen IDL topic is transportation and vehicles. An update of the termly homework has been sent home, reading books will now be changed on Fridays.

Literacy – In writing we are creating stories based on folklore around the Northern lights. We will also be exploring non-fiction texts through our IDL topic. We are building our listening and talking skills through Circle time activities as well as groupwork in class. In reading we will be learning about the purpose of different texts as well as exploring different types of question we can ask and answer about texts.

Numeracy and Maths – This term we continue our learning on the four operations addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. I am checking that children know the important basic facts which will help them with maths and further details have been sent home in the homework pocket. We are also learning about measurement, fractions, decimals, and percentages.

Health and wellbeing - We are continuing our compassionate and connected classroom sessions, thinking about how we think, feel and behave and ways to manage our emotions and behaviours. Our SHANARI focus for January has been healthy and we will be looking at being included as our focus in February.

P.E. is on Monday and Wednesday, please make sure your child has P.E. kit and suitable footwear.

Throughout the week we may undertake outdoor learning so please make sure your child has suitable warm clothing, waterproofs will be provided by the school.

Please be reminded of the following health and safety reminders, in particular the highlighted ones:

- Children should not come to school too early but should aim to arrive as close to the bell as possible.
 Children will be met in the playground by a member of staff and shown where to line up.
- In the morning if you wish to speak to a teacher or Mrs Byrne please call to make an appointment or you can pass on a message via the office.
- If your child is unable to attend school you should contact the school advising them of the reason for absence on each and every day your child is absent from school. Please note that if your child has been vomiting or has had diarrhoea they should not attend school and should remain absent for 48 hours since their last bout of vomiting/diarrhoea.
- For safety reasons, it is really important that the yellow zig zag lines on the road outside the school are kept clear. PLEASE DO NOT DROP OFF YOUR CHILD/PARK ON THESE LINES. ALSO NO TURNING AT THE SCHOOL ENTRANCE. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE NEW NO TURNING/PARKING SIGNS AT THE ENTRANCE.

Cost of the School Day

Talking about money can be challenging. When struggling with costs, you may feel unable to talk about money, however, it could mean that you are missing out on help available and it may also be affecting how young people feel at school. There are lots of ways we break down the barriers associated with poverty and here are just a few:

- Building a culture of dignity and respect, where we all care for each other and give support when it is needed.
- Having a thoughtful approach to how donations are given, eg. 'chuck it in a bucket' with no obligation to donate.
- Carefully considering how to take part in special days such as World Book Day with minimal costs to families.
- Providing recycled school clothing free of charge to anyone that requires it.
- Never charging for materials or experiences that take place during the school day.
- Having a 'No Child Left Behind Approach' for residential trips, funded (partly or in full, depending on circumstances) by our enterprise projects, local grants and support from the Parent Council.
- Working with the Parent Council to provide low-cost or free social events.
- Asking for donations from the Parent Council. They have previously funded a whole-school set of class novels, buses for school trips and play equipment and so on.
