P4-7

We have had an exceptionally busy, but very successful Term 4 so far! They thoroughly enjoyed the outing to The Aberdeen Science Centre and have written a recount of the event. They were fully engaged in experimenting with all the different learning areas at the Science Centre and learnt a lot about inheritance and genes in their workshop. They loved working in groups to design a baby Reebop – using playdough, googly eyes, and coloured pipe cleaners. In their groups, they had to take genes from the "mom" and "dad" and "design" their own mini Reebop. We are doing a lot on work on Fractions, percentages and decimals in Maths whilst continuing with Times Tables, Mental Math and Sum Dog challenges. This term in English, our focus is developing our writing skills using our "tools for learning". We have so far written an imaginative "Journey Story", a recount piece from V.E. Day (after a visit to The Memorial), an invitation and soon we begin an "interview with an alien" – which will have us all giggling – for sure! In P.E. we are focusing on fitness and playing games like Rounders, encouraging maximum participation, team work and leadership. ATTENDANCE

Habits of good regular attendance are important for your child's educational development, social skills and future positive pathways. However, we do understand that absence due to illness is unavoidable and should this be long

term we will aim to support parents/carers in any way we can. In line with Moray Council guidelines absences will be monitored and we will contact parents/carers if absences rates are causing concern.

Please be aware that if your child has vomited/had diarrhoea they should not attend school and should remain absent for 48 hours since their last bout of vomiting/diarrhoea. This is particularly important to minimise the spread and to keep the school open.

- Children should not come to school too early but should aim to arrive as close to the bell as possible.

ROAD SAFETY MARKINGS AT THE SCHOOL GATE

Please be reminded that you should not be stopping or parking on the yellow zig-zag lines outside the car park gate, particularly at dropping off and picking up times. We understand that stopping or parking on Chapel Street can be challenging and that you want your child to get out of the car as near to the school as possible, however there is a very important reason for these lines and that is to protect children who are coming round the corner and also children crossing the road to school. Due to their size they may not always be visible to a driver. Safety of children is a top priority and your help with this is appreciated.

It was raised that our "no stopping" policeman signs have not been used much recently, however these should not be the only reason to adhere to the road safety markings. We will try to put these out when we can but in the meantime please be considerate of the safety of children.

Cost of the School Day

Talking about money can be challenging. When struggling with costs, you may feel unable to talk about money, however, it could mean that you are missing out on help available and it may also be affecting how young people feel at school. At St Thomas', we want every family to know that support is available to reduce the cost of the school day and we are here to help families maximise income.

we are an inclusive school, where everyone belongs and can take part in everything we offer, without any barriers.

We believe we offer high-quality experiences for all children and we then offer additional experiences or materials for those that require them, ensuring equity of opportunity. There are lots of ways we break down the barriers associated with poverty and here are just a few:

- Building a culture of dignity and respect, where we all care for each other and give support when it is needed.
- Having a thoughtful approach to how donations are given, eg. 'chuck it in a bucket' with no obligation to donate.
- Carefully considering how to take part in special days such as World Book Day with minimal costs to families.
- Providing recycled school clothing free of charge to anyone that requires it.
- We do encourage pupils to change into a PE kit for PE lessons. Boys and girls are offered separate changing areas. For pupils who do not have a PE kit from home, we offer a new PE kit (shorts and t-shirt) for them to wear and keep at school. Please send your child to school with suitable footwear for PE, it is not easy to do PE in heavy boats, slippers or wellies.
- Never charging for materials or experiences that take place during the school day.
- Having a 'No Child Left behind Approach' for residential trips, funded (partly or in full, depending on circumstances) by our enterprise projects, local grants and support from the Parent Council.
- Working with the Parent Council to provide low-cost or free social events.
- Asking for donations from the Parent Council. They have previously funded a whole-school set of class novels, buses for school trips and play equipment and so on.
