




# We are:

- Developing our health and wellbeing curriculum by delivering daily wellbeing sessions
- We host weekly assemblies which have a different theme each weekthese mainly focus on our wellbeing
- We have taken the time during lockdown to review a new resource called 'Building Resilience' this will be implemented in term 4
- We all have daily well-being checkins which are now a key part to our day
- We have introduced soft start from P1-P7 to ensure all children are READY to learn
- We have introduced our three school rules of READY, RESPECTFUL and SAFE
- We have introduced our 'Every Child Deserves a Champion' procedure across the school
- We have implemented weekly outdoor learning sessions across every class
- Compiling an audit of our HWB curriculum.

## What's next?

- Develop a termly form to gather health and wellbeing data on a termly basis
- Continue to embed our monthly wellbeing indicator assembly to develop children's understanding of these indicators
- Begin to embed the building resilience programme
- Connect with our learners to develop our playground into a place for everyone
- Develop leadership roles across our school and children to act as Wellbeing Warriors
- Develop our 'Respect Me' policy to ensure all children feel welcome and free from discrimination in our school community
- Develop our Health and Wellbeing library for pupils, parents and staff to support our deliver of the curriculum.




### We are:

- Developing our reading culture by ensuring every child in every class has an opportunity to read in class everyday
- Engaging with First Minister's Reading challenge to support our reading culture development
- Reviewing our handwriting resource and using letter join which will support our fine motor skills and all our parents can access this at home
- We have reinstated our reading recovery teacher to ensure the best outcomes for all our children
- As a staff team we have engaged with 'Word Boost' and we will embed this fully in term 4 across all stages in our school
- We have reviewed our assessment data and writing will become a focus for our school as we move into next session
- Personalising our literacy framework to ensure it makes explicit with 'The Abbey Way' for early level.

### What's next?

- We will introduce free write Friday to all our children across the school
- Work with NAC PLA to ensure all staff have accessed CLPL for SHORS (reading strategies) and listening and talking skills
- Develop reading areas in our school playgrounds - led by House Captain team
- Introduce further support interventions to ensure all children are working at their most capable level in literacy and English
- Audit our reading culture against the toolkit to build an action plan with our reading ambassadors
- Develop a literacy support package with parents for parents to ensure parents are engaged and fully involved in their child's learning
- Continue to personalise our literacy framework for first and second level.



### We are:

- Developing our approach to integrating TEAMS and Seesaw into daily life at Abbey
- Using various platforms to raise the profile of our school and share our successes with our wider school community
- Developing our in house CLPL programme to develop staff confidence in the use of digital technologies
- We are completing an audit of our technologies curriculum to ensure depth, breadth, balance and challenge for all our learners
- Using our parent body to support our digital development as tech team ambassadors
- We are reviewing a range of resources to supplement our technology curriculum
- Engaging with national supports to develop our in school and online offering.

### What's next?

- Build a technology framework ensuring progression across all levels of the curriculum
- Develop our tech team leadership roles for pupils with parents as an extracurricular activity
- Continue to keep abreast of national policy reflecting the ever changing landscape of digital technologies
- Continue to embed use of technology to engage with all our learners
- Develop a guide for parents to understand why we use the range of digital platforms to connect with our school community
