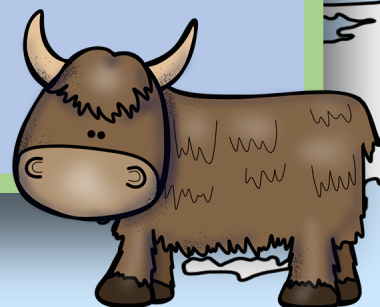


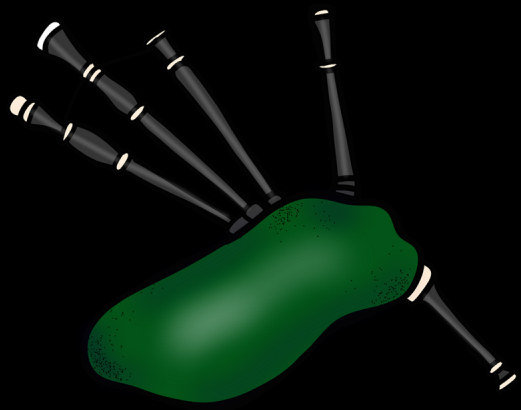
# Where does tartan come from?

# What is Tartan?

This comes from the Gaelic word "clanna" which means children.

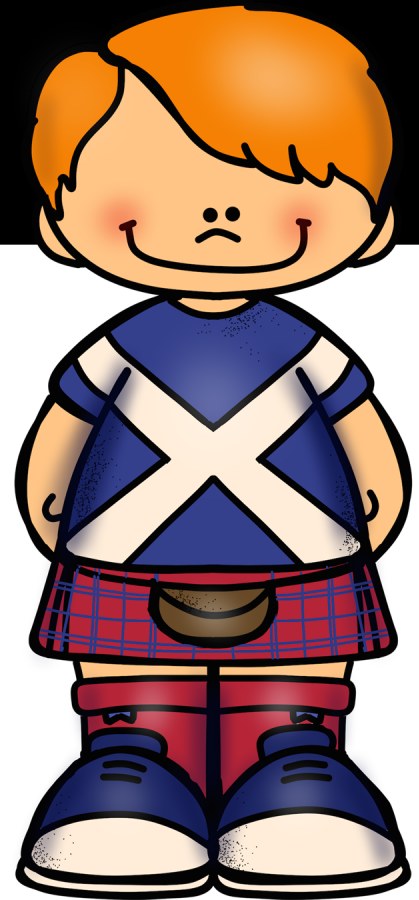
Clans all have their own special history and identity. Most Scottish clans have their own tartan design. A tartan design is a lot like plaid with lines of different colors overlapping.

Now it's your turn! Take a Look at the example below. This tartan is used on a Kilt. A kilt is a formal outfit for men and women in Scotland

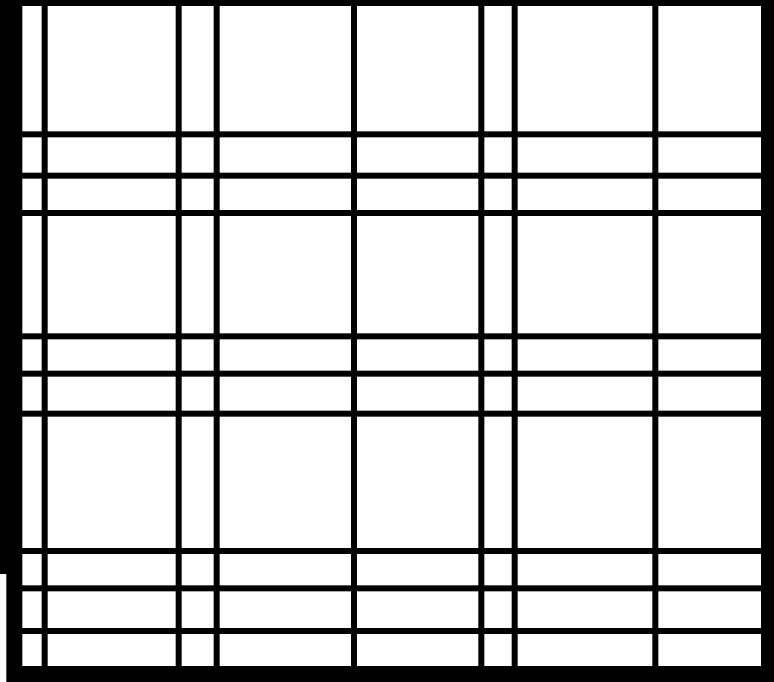


Notice how the tartan is made up of:

OVERLAPPING LINES

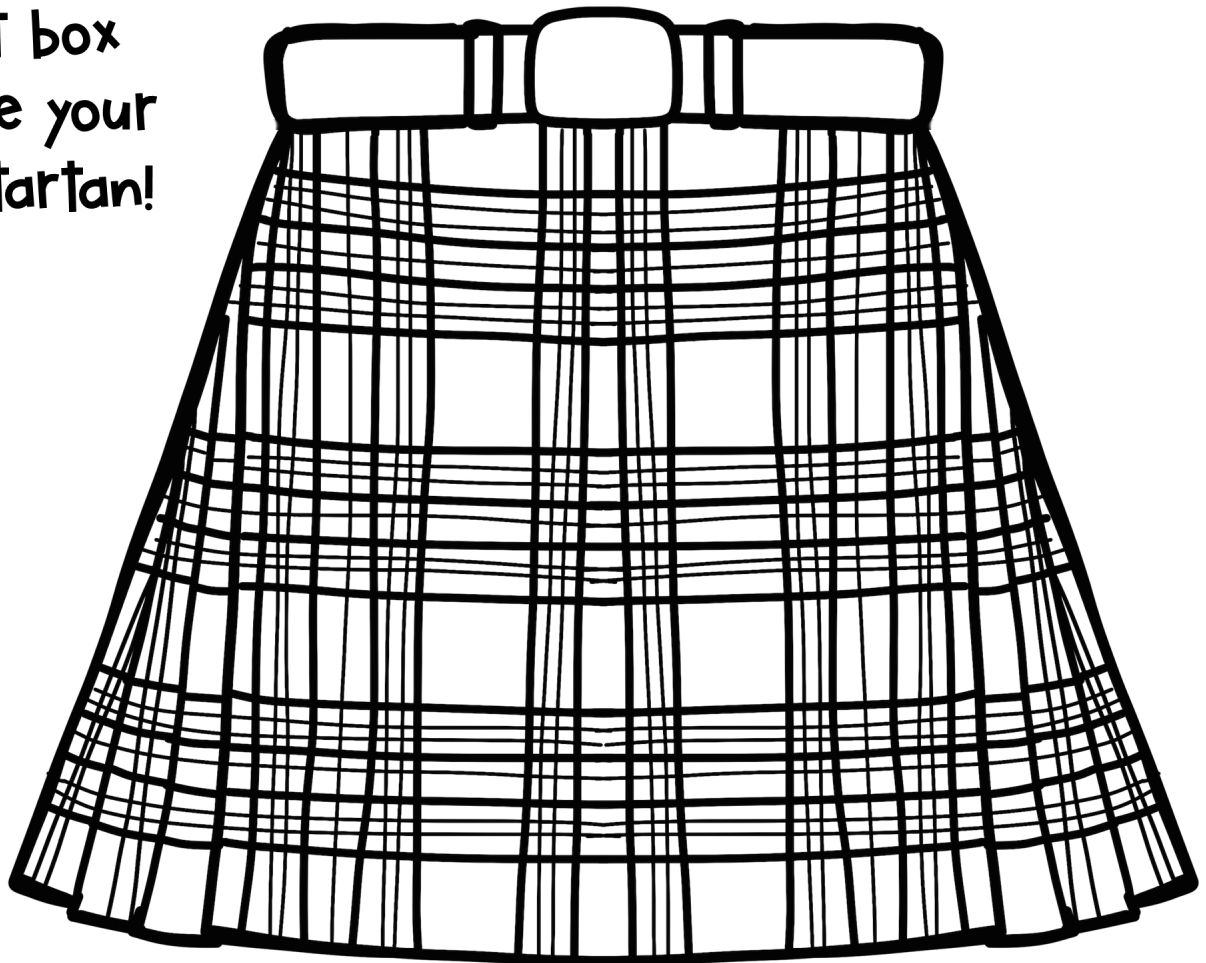
