

✓Officially opened our new outdoor classroom, Driftwood.

✓We developed our approaches to teaching literacy and numeracy outdoors with children having regular learning outside.

✓We created the Anchor Spot in our open area and new approaches to nurture.

 \checkmark We developed home learning and moved to online homework.

✓ Pupils are confident in using Seesaw and Glow to access learning.

 \checkmark We embedded Boosting Reading across the school to provide additional support to pupils who needed it.

✓Pupil voice has been leading school improvements and work towards accreditations. The Rights Respecting Schools Group received the Gold Award . Our Eco group have received their second green flag. The outdoor group have secured additional ground for the school through their planning application and have plans for a wellbeing garden, outdoor learning zone and sports ground. Our Primary 4's are working towards their Gold RSPB award.

✓Our Family Learning Team have supported us with training STEM leaders in P5 and our P7's have attained the John Muir Award.

 \checkmark We have produced a range of leaflets to support parents with learning at home.

 \checkmark We have secured funding from a range of partners and providers to develop our outdoors.



Throughout the year we gather lots of information on how our children are progressing in their learning. To monitor their progress we watch children working through tasks, listen to what they say, ask important questions, set challenges and use some standardised assessments. We get together and look carefully at the Curriculum for Excellence experiences and outcomes to ensure children are making progress.

North Ayrshire Council also ask us to summarise our children's progress in reading, writing, listening and talking as well as numeracy and maths. They ask us to look particularly at children who have reached the end of the Early, First and Second Levels: P.1, P.4 and P.7. We are proud of how well our children are progressing.


