Main feedback from event

Schools liked the following aspects:

- The red, amber, green aspects of the selfevaluation toolkit
- The associated questionnaires/ surveys for stakeholders
- The poster developed by FV and campaigns used by LAs.
- Inclusion of Early Years in process
- That children were involved in the video about attendance gives buy in.

Schools also commented that the toolkit allows for a systematic exploration of approaches and can highlight issues they weren't aware of. Also that it might be useful to try some test of change with the toolkit.
