Rights Respecting School Award

As part of our journey towards becoming a silver accredited Rights Respecting School, all pupils were given the opportunity to select which articles of the United Nations Convention of the **Rights of the Child** (UNCRC) match our school values of Respect, Equality and Determination. The pupils selected the following articles:

We have updated and adapted Harvie Heros to incorporate a monthly focus on the selected articles. We have been utilising the house assemblies, year group assemblies and teacher nominations to highlight and discuss how each article is demonstrated and experienced in Auchenharvie Academy. The Rights Ambassadors have been working on creating a whole school rights charter. A rights charter provides an opportunity to learn about specific articles and helps to establish and build shared values and relationships for creating a rights respecting ethos in the class room and the whole school. We are aiming to complete the charter by the end of December.


sics and how the police investigates serious crime.

See Me See Change

A group of 12 S5 pupils represented the school at the See Me event last month where we joined other secondary pupils from across North Ayrshire to take part in See Me See Change training on tackling mental health stigma and discrimination in schools. These pupils will work alongside trained staff in the school to take this approach forward. The pupils were a credit to the school, and we look forward to working with them once the pupil's prelim examination diet has concluded.

Megan's Space

We are thankful for the continued support we've received from one of our local charities, Megan's Space, who came in to work with some of our S4-S6 pupils prior to the prelim examinations. The theme of the morning focused on goals setting, techniques for prelim preparation and overcoming exam anxiety including learning and practising havening (alternative therapy technique). The session was delivered by a Life Coach, a Megan's Space fundraiser and an Anxiety Therapist. The feedback received from all pupils who attended was very positive and it was clear that another session tailored to pupils' experience after prelim examinations would be beneficial. This session will be made available to all S4-S6 pupils on Thursday 19th January.

Physical Education

This term there has been lots of fantastic achievements and events going on in the PE department. On our return from the October break we were straight into competing at the Ayrshire Schools Cross Country Championships where we had success for the first time in many



years. Our S1 sisters Lola and Emi achieved 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place respectively in their race.

We then hosted our Annual Active Girls Day where all S1-3 girls were invited down to PE to take part in a range of activities including football, netball, fitness and trampoline. We were also joined by Tass Girls football coaches on the day who managed to recruit a few new players for their team!



In November we hosted a staff Handball CPD course where our PE staff and others from the local secondary schools were trained in delivering this new activity. This has been introduced to many classes now with all pupils really enjoying it.



Physical Education

November was also the start of Staff v Pupils competitions. The first event organised by the S6 leadership group was Dodgeball. As always this was played in a



friendly BUT competitive spirit with the staff of course getting the first win of the year!



This has also been a busy term for our Sports Development pupils who are now putting their learning into practice. They have been delivering a number of PE sessions now to our S1 groups and doing a great job of it at that.





Social Subjects & RMPS

In June of this year, pupils visited Krakow, to enhance their understanding of the atrocities of the Holocaust. Pupils visited many historical sites, such as Auschwitz and Schindler's Museum. Pupils reflected positively on this experience and plans are already in place for another visit in 2024.







Fonce Scotland delivered a presentation to senior and S4 pupils on Terrorism Prevention. This informative information session, not only supported Modern Studies pupils in the World Issues unit of their course, but also allowed them to address many of the key issues surrounding the topic in real life contexts. This year we are delighted to be again organising our annual Edinburgh Christmas Markets trip for seniors. This has not taken place since 2019 due to Covid, so staff and pupils are looking forward to its return!

S4 pupils will be visiting the Scottish Parliament in December to support learning in the National Modern Studies course. Pupils are given a tour of the building, including the debating chamber, as well as a chance to meet MSPs.

Duke of Edinburgh

We are delighted to announce that Madison Webster, Beth Hill, Brandon McLarney, and Naeve Muir have all achieved GOLD award for Duke of Edinburgh.

After several years of disruption due to Covid 19 we are so proud of all their hard work. They will now be invited to Holyrood Palace in July 2023 to receive their gold award from HRH Prince Edward. Due to Covid restrictions, this group were required to complete their bronze, silver and gold expeditions in one year.

This meant that they were camping almost every week! They faced all the elements that the Scottish weather can provide – and they all coped admirably. We are sure the skills they developed: team work, resilience and self-belief will stand them in good stead as they progress through life. However, the expeditions are only half the story!
