Our new S2 pupils were involved in workshops exploring contamination with the Curiosity Cube.







North Ayrshire and Ayrshire Athletics Championships

All pupils represented their school brilliantly with five pupils finishing $1^{\rm st}$ or $2^{\rm nd}$ in their event to qualify for the Ayrshire Athletics Championships. In June, at the Ayrshire Championships, Emy Finnigan won silver in the 1500m and Lola Finnigan won gold in the 800m to become Ayrshire champion. Family Learning



Over the past year the Family Learning team have been working with a number of parents/carers through our Parents in Partnership programme.

This programme continues to grow and be a success for new S1 families. The team have offered computing classes for parents/carers with the brilliant Rosslyn Lee, provided study skills opportunities for young people and also been involved in writing a Child Protection programme with CELCIS. This would not have possible without the work from our wonderful Family Learning worker, Linda Mahood.

The work around equity continues to grow with our new and pre loved uniform store supporting many families in our community. We have had a number of uniform pop ups during school holidays and plan to have another in July this summer to support our families. We have also built strong partnerships with the Money Matters team at North Ayrshire, offering financial support to many and also working closely with the Child Poverty Action Group for Scotland to break down potential barriers around costs associated with the school day. This has been done by working with many of our young people who are now Ambassadors for Cost of the School Day and involved in national work around this.





Our prom wear initiative continues to grow and we are overwhelmed by the generosity of our community who contribute to this on a weekly basis. It simply wouldn't be possible to offer this initiative without these contributions. We wholeheartedly believe that all pupils should be able to go to their prom without any financial barriers stopping them and our aim is to provide this for them.

North Ayrshire Sports Academy

We are delighted to have had 10 of our young people completing this year's NASA programme. The programme, organised and delivered by Active Schools saw the pupils complete phase 1 of the programme where they gained introductory level coaching qualifications before choosing a specialism in phase 2. This allowed pupils to take part in a pathway of their choice. Pathways included Football, Multi Sports, Netball, ASN, Dance/ Gymnastics.
























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
