# Rights Respecting School Award

# Work Experience Police Scotland

A big well done to Jayden Wright, Bethany Parker and Terri O'Hare who completed a week's Work Experience with Police Scotland and done themselves and Auchenharvie Academy proud.



As part of the programme pupils participated in scenario-based incidents that police attend, they visited Kilmarnock Sheriff Court, had a question-and-answer session with Judge Mundell. The pupils attended the Road Policing Department in Irvine Police Office and received inputs off the role on Road Policing and got to see how police equipment is used to stop vehicles. During the programme the pupils attended the Police Horse Stables, watched the Police Horses training, and learned about their role in the police and what their duties are at public order events. At the end of the week the pupils were given their well-earned Work Experience certificates by Chief Inspector Normansell.







Throughout the week the pupils visited Ardrossan Coastguard, Mountain Rescue, Police Marine Unit, Prestwick Airport, CID and had lots of fun learning about police procedures investigating crime and how the Police work with partner agencies to keep people safe.

# S1/S2 Employability



This year, we introduced Employability to our S1 and S2 curriculum. Pupils are exploring various post school destinations, working on developing skills and qualities. We have the support of a range of local business. Amalgamate training have delivered CPR training to all of our S2 pupils as part of this course which was a great success. We have input from more employers for S1 and S2 in the coming session.









#### **Construction Course**

Our construction course continues to successfully run at Auchenharvie Academy where we are supported by Ayrshire College in the delivery. We have had many employers working alongside our construction pupils. Robertson Construction have taken these pupils on a week long work experience placement to show pupils the relevance of their school based learning. Pupils are going out to their local construction site at Irvine at various points in their project to learn about their progress. RJ McLeod are another employer investing in our construction pupils by putting them all through their CSCS card training. This training allows our pupils to be able to go out and work in a construction site when they leave school. RJ McLeod are very kindly fully funding the training of all our construction pupils.

### **CSCS** Training

RJ McLeod have been working closely with pupils at Auchenharvie Academy who are interested in a career in the construction industry. They conducted a 7 hour session to put our pupils through training to achieve a CSCS card which will allow them to work on a construction site. All of our pupils passed and have achieved their card which will help them secure a positive destination after school. We would like to pass on a huge thanks to Christina McKirtick and her team at RJ McLeod. Without all of their input and dedication, this would not have been possible. We look forward to continuing our partnership with RJ McLeod going forward.


