

### Monster Soup

Pick a letter and make some monster soup with lots of ingredients beginning with chosen letter. You'll need a big pot, a spoon and lots of giggles. For example, for s you could include socks, slippers, stickers, soap. Yum!

### Puppet Theatre

Use an old box (cereal, shoe box etc) Cut a hole in the front and at the top. Cut out some of your favourite characters from old magazines and stick them onto wooden spoons/lolly pop sticks etc. Have fun retelling some stories or make some up of your own.
