

<p><u>Monster Soup</u></p> <p>Pick a letter and make some monster soup with lots of ingredients beginning with chosen letter. You'll need a big pot, a spoon and lots of giggles. For example, for s you could include socks, slippers, stickers, soap. Yum!</p>	<p><u>Puppet Theatre</u></p> <p>Use an old box (cereal, shoe box etc) Cut a hole in the front and at the top. Cut out some of your favourite characters from old magazines and stick them onto wooden spoons/lolly pop sticks etc. Have fun retelling some stories or make some up of your own.</p>	<p><u>Sock Puppets</u></p> <p>Use some old socks to make sock puppets. This will really help your child with their spelling.</p> 	<p><u>Going on a Picnic</u></p> <p>One person begins by saying, "I am going on a picnic and I will bring some fruit." Next person says, "I am going on a picnic and I will bring some fruit and some sandwiches." Keep going until someone forgets one of the items from the list. Great for memory and vocabulary!</p>		<p><u>Letter Formation</u></p> <p>Pour salt or sugar on to a tray. Give your child some letters or words to copy. Shake the tray gently to erase and try some more.</p>
