

## **Welcome to Primary 6/5**

Have a peek below to see what we will be learning in term 1.

### **LITERACY**

We will be reading the novel 'Hole's by Louis Sachar. Through the novel study, we will explore setting and characterisation.

We will also use the main themes of the story to inspire our own writing. Together we will improve our existing knowledge of VCOP and apply this to our writing. Group reading sessions will take place throughout the week applying a range of 'Blooms' questions.

### **NUMERACY**

A daily mental maths session will improve speed in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. For our main topics we will cover whole number as well as shape, position and movement; we will build on our existing knowledge of whole number, explore 2D/3D shapes, investigate how to estimate, create and measure angles, and further expand our problem solving skills.

### **R.M.E.**

We will study Sikhism by researching the origins of the religion, core Sikh beliefs and build a comparison of Christianity and this major world religion.

### **HEALTH AND WELLBEING**

We will get back into the swing of school based learning by taking part in community builder activities and everything we do in class will have a focus on Health and Wellbeing.

We will be learning more about staying safe and healthy while exploring our responsibilities around this. We will also reflect on our experiences, rebuild routines, as well as build resilience and communication. In P.E. we will use the outdoors as our gym hall and will be developing our stamina and fitness levels through fitness circuits and perform different exercises with a degree of accuracy & control.

### **LANGUAGES**

Revising our French vocabulary will strengthen our confidence and make applying basic terms a regular part of our daily learning which we will develop next term.

### **STEAM**

Our STEAM activities will be class based for the moment due to current restrictions. We will participate in lots of Science Talk about a variety of topics which helps us develop as scientifically literate citizens. Real life science and innovation will be explored to give our learning context.

### **SOCIAL STUDIES**

Our class novel is set in America and over time the landscape changes drastically. We will take this opportunity to learn about geography of the United States as well as the effects of global warming on our environment. We will also explore Racism in America studying key figures such as Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King.

### **EXPRESSIVE ARTS**

We will be building on our existing skills by looking at the technique of pointillism and comparing how different materials create different textures and effects.

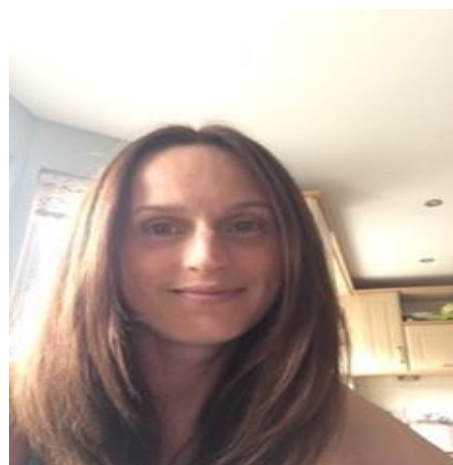
## **😊 HOW CAN YOU HELP AT HOME? 😊**
