

<p>Literacy – Listening Activity</p> <p><u>Do as I say, Not as I do.</u></p> <p>This activity is a ‘fun-twist’ on Simon Says... You need to play this with an adult (leader). You have to do the movements you hear them say, not what you see them do. e.g. The leader says “Simon says clap your hands”, while jumping up and down. You need to listen carefully, remembering to ignore what you see. Have fun!</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>Keep Dancing</u></p> <p>Make up a dance routine to your favourite song. <p>Literacy</p> <p><u>It's all in the name</u></p> <p>Write your name. Try your second name too.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decorate it with shiny paper, buttons, etc. • Try bubble writing, write all your name in capitals. • Use playdough to make your name. • Use paint to paint your name. • Can you think of other ways to write your name? 	<p>Early Level Home Learning Ideas – Grid 1</p> <p>If you are off school self-isolating you will receive an email to your Glow account with links to different learning activities that your class will be doing. E.g. start with getting out of bed. Then put them in order. Why don't you look at the sky at night and then draw a picture using chalk and black paper. Can you see the moon and stars?</p>
<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Be a Letter and word Detective</u></p> <p>Can you find tricky words in your reading book? How many times can you see ‘the’ in your book? Can you find vowels in words? - a,e,i,o,u. - e.g. bus. Choose a word or sound and go searching.</p>	<p>Cross Curricular Challenge</p> <p><u>Let's Recycle</u></p> <p>What can you build using paper, card and materials from your blue recycling bin? Be creative.</p> 	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Fractions</u></p> <p>Fold a piece of paper in $\frac{1}{2}$ to show 2 equal parts. Then fold it again to show 4 equal parts. Now – using a slice of bread, show $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ in different ways. Make a shape.</p>
