

<p><b><u>Literacy – Listening Activity</u></b> <b><u>What sounds do you hear?</u></b></p> <p>As you walk around your house or outside in your garden, listen very carefully and enjoy all the different sounds you hear.</p> <p>Draw a picture of your sound walk and share it with an adult.</p> 	<p><b><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></b> <b><u>Worry Jar</u></b></p> <p>“Don’t fill your head with worries, fill the jar instead.”</p> <p>Decorate a jar, make it really colourful and bright.</p> <p>Then talk to an adult about things you are worried about. Write them down (an adult can help) and put them into the jar.</p>  <p>You will feel much better.</p>	<p><b><u>Numeracy</u></b> <b><u>Domino Houses</u></b></p> <p>Draw the outline of houses and write a different number in each roof, (0 – 12).</p> <p>Turn over your dominos one at a time and count the dots.</p> <p>Place the domino on top of the house with the same number.</p>
