

<p>Literacy – Listening Activity Talking and Listening</p> <p>“I went to the supermarket and I bought....”</p> <p>a → apple, b → banana, c → ...</p> <p>Think of something to buy with each letter of the alphabet.</p> <p>Clap out how many syllables are in each word. e.g. apple – 2, banana – 3.</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing What makes up your heart?</p> <p>Think of all the people and things that you love.</p>  <p>Draw a picture of a great big heart and cut it out (ask an adult to help). Then divide the heart into pieces and write down or draw all the things that are important to you on the pieces.</p>	<p>Numeracy Numbers</p> <p>Practise number formation from 0 – 10 (or higher if you can).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use felt pens, crayons, pencils or paint to make your number posters. • Use playdough to form your numbers. • Write your numbers in the air. • Use chalk to write your numbers on paper or outside. <p>Have Fun!</p>
