

<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Alphabet Hunt</u></p> <p>Can you work your way through the alphabet from A-Z searching for items in the house or the garden that start with each letter. Try to spell each word and write it down. Ask an adult to check your spelling and see if you spelled the words correctly.</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>Copy my moves</u></p> <p>Try this activity with a family member. It can be played with 2 or more people. One of you will perform a move and the other will copy it. Add a move each time so that by the end you are performing a sequence of moves and you partner is copying. Then see if you can swap roles.</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Sequencing</u></p> <p>Sequence numbers in the range of 1-1000, e.g. write 198, 199, 200, 201 on separate pieces of paper, mix them up and sequence them. Repeat for other sequences.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you order numbers which aren't in sequence, e.g. 803, 71, 395, 120?</p>
<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Book Review</u></p> <p>Read your favourite book. Can you write a book review and design a new front cover? Write about the story giving a summary of what it is about. Write about your favourite part in the book. Tell us about your favourite character. Would you recommend it to a friend? Finally give a rating and a reason why it is your favourite book.</p>	<p><u>First Level Home Learning Ideas – Grid 4</u></p> <p>If you are off school self-isolating you will receive an email to your Glow account with links to different learning activities that your class will be doing.</p> <p>Remember, your teacher is still teaching the rest of your class so will only be able to contact after 3pm.</p> <p>Have a look at some of these activities if you fancy an extra challenge to keep learning while you are away from school.</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Timetable</u></p> <p>Make a timetable for your day. You can draw it or write it. Can you describe your day to someone else using the words 'first', 'before', 'after', 'then' etc.?</p> <p>Challenge: Can you make a timetable for someone in your family? Listen to them describe their day then make a timetable for them.</p>
<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Question or Statement?</u></p> <p>Think about 5 things you would like to tell your friends or teacher. Write them down in sentences. Now think of 5 questions you would like to ask them. Write them down too. Do all your sentences have capital letter and full stops and your questions have question marks? You can get your family to ask you more questions.</p>	<p>Cross Curricular Challenge</p> <p><u>Map</u></p> <p>Can you draw a map showing your route to school? Start at your own home and draw a map marking any key features like shops or parks on the way to help you. Remember to show roads and think about how to safely get to school.</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Toy Counting</u></p> <p>Gather three sets of toys. You might have a set of cars, lego or dolls. Count how many toys you have in each set. Create a table to record your results. Can you use tally marks?</p> <p>Create a pictograph or a bar graph to show the number of toys you have in each set. Remember to label your graph. Ask an adult to create some questions. Can you use your graph to answer these?</p>
