Snow Dough

You need :

- * 1/3 cup of vegetable oil
- * 2 cups of cornflour
- * 3 teaspoons of glitter

Mix the glitter into the corn flour. Add the oil slowly to the corn flour, mixing as you go. Rub in like when making pastry. When it feels smooth and slightly damp it's ready.
