Tartan weaving.

Take a sheet of coloured paper. Cut into a square and fold in half. Starting at the folded edge and stopping 1 inch from the end, cut evenly spaced slits in the paper. Drawing vertical lines for your child to follow might be helpful. Take some other coloured paper and cut into strips. The strips must be longer than your square of paper. Take one paper strip and weave it across the slits going over and under the slits. Move this strip to the top and begin the second one. Going under and over this time. Weave more strips in an alternating pattern until your square is full. Now you have your very own Tartan.

Recipe of the week

Cloud Dough

Add 1/2 cup of lotion (regular or baby lotion) to a bowl. Add a few drops of food colouring and mix together until combined. Add one cup of corn flour and mix until combined. Then take out the dough and place on some greaseproof paper. Knead with your hands until it forms a dough like consistency. If it's still too sticky add a tablespoon of corn flour.
