

<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></b></p> <p>This term, Primary 6 will be looking at how to make good eating choices by exploring the NHS Eatwell Guide. To reinforce our understanding, we will look at food labels, the information they contain and how they can help guide the choices we make. P.E. will focus on building fitness to improve our strength and stamina. We will also continue to develop a positive approach to learning by maintain a growth mind-set.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Literacy</u></b></p> <p>Primary 6 will be focusing a lot on reading this term. We are going to expand our fluency and expression when reading out-loud to ensure we provide clear meaning for listeners. In addition, by focusing on the mood of a text we become increasingly aware of different techniques used by the writer to engage us as readers. We can then apply this understanding to our own writing to bring depth and quality.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Numeracy</u></b></p> <p>Term 2 will look at Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. This is a great area of learning which will allow pupils to apply their knowledge of multiplication and division from last term. Primary 6 will also look at Information Handling and the different formats we can use to present data. As well as learning to read graphs, the pupils will create graphs with increasing independence using their learning in the Discovery Zone.</p>

Learning about our past ensures an understanding of the future and how our actions can shape the world around us. The pupils will be expanding their musical skills by looking at tempo and rhythm through tuned percussion with glockenspiels.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Science</u></b></p> <p>Primary 6 will be exploring Forces, Electricity and Waves. This is an exciting and diverse topic which relates to an everyday understanding of our world. We will link this learning to different scientific skills including graph making to demonstrate our knowledge. In addition, we will conduct experiments in relation to COP26.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Technology</u></b></p> <p>Primary 6 will be expanding their computing skills by engaging with different software including Word, Excel, PowerPoint and the OneDrive. We will explore how these systems can support our learning and highlight ways to improve our work.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Languages</u></b></p> <p>During Term 2, for French and Spanish we will look at basic classroom instructions. Primary 6 will be able to confidently follow and use simple phrases and nouns on a regular basis. We will also continue to reinforce previous learning to increase pupil confidence and fluency in both languages through <a href="#">Languagenut</a>.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>How can you help at home</u></b></p> <p>Practise Times Tables often to build knowledge and confidence.
