

<p><b><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></b></p> <p>In our P.E. lessons, we will develop gymnastics skills on the apparatus. For health and safety reasons pupils need to wear appropriate P.E. kit. Earrings should be micro-taped before coming to school on P.E. days. As part of the Rights Respecting School Programme, we will explore <b>Article 7</b>: the right to name and nationality, <b>Article 13</b>: the right to freedom of expression and <b>Article 30</b>: the rights of children from minority groups.</p>	<p><b><u>Literacy</u></b></p> <p>This term we will develop as story writers. We will do this by orally telling stories. Adults will scribe these for us. Later we will act out our stories. We will continue to enjoy the Bug Club reading programme and reading skills will continue to develop. We will use our knowledge of phonics to help us blend sounds together. We will use punctuation to help us to read with expression. We will read with a partner, by ourselves and in a group. We will learn to listen carefully to our 'shoulder partner' when we discuss likes, dislikes and opinions and we will feedback what we have learnt to the rest of the class.</p>	<p><b><u>Numeracy</u></b></p> <p>Early level: We will use money to pay for items up to 10p and we will become familiar with other coins and notes. We will also investigate position and direction, linking this with programmable or remote-controlled toys. We will learn how to read a calendar to find specific dates, most importantly our own birthdays! We will continue to use number up to 20 to become confident in adding and subtracting 1, 2 or 3. First level: Pupils will continue to work with 2 digit numbers, rounding to the nearest ten.</p>
<p><b><u>Social Studies</u></b></p> <p>We will explore the topic of Toys from the Past which will help us to link the past to important people in our lives.
