

<p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></p> <p>In our P.E. lessons, we will develop gymnastics skills on the apparatus. For health and safety reasons pupils need to wear shorts and either sandshoes or trainers. Earrings should be micro-taped before coming to school on P.E. days.</p> <p>We will be learning about the importance of healthy habits including when and how to wash hands appropriately. We will be brushing our teeth on a daily basis.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u></p> <p>We will learn to listen carefully to our 'shoulder partner' when we discuss likes, dislikes and opinions and we will feedback what we have learnt to the rest of the class. We will begin to use our recognition of the sounds of letters to help us blend sounds together to read words and we will learn to recognise some familiar words by sight.</p> <p>We will practise correct letter formation and finger spacing between words. We will work in partnership with an adult to write our own stories which we will act out for our classmates.</p>	<p><u>Numeracy</u></p> <p>We will become familiar with numbers up to 20. We will practise adding and subtracting within 10.</p> <p>We will become familiar with coins and notes and we will use these in role-play situations. We will learn the days of the week and the months of the year.</p> <p>(Please note that some children will work on an individual maths plan depending on their stage of development.)</p>
<p><u>Social Studies</u></p> <p>We will develop an understanding of how we can improve growing conditions for our plants by making and using our own compost. We will develop our engineering skills as we work safely with different types of tools.</p>
