



Literacy

Our focus in Literacy this term will be on developing the children's early reading and writing skills. The children will continue to practise correct letter formation and build on their phonics learning, with a strong emphasis on reading and writing three-letter words. They will also learn to recognise and read a range of common words and tricky words, helping to build confidence and fluency. Reading books will be sent home regularly so that children can practise and apply the learning that has taken place in class, and we appreciate your continued support with this at home.

Health and Wellbeing



During Term 2, within the curricular area of Health and Wellbeing, the children will be learning about emotional regulation and how to recognise and manage their feelings. They will be introduced to simple, practical strategies to help support themselves using our whole-school programme, Emotion Works. We will also be exploring a Farm to Fork learning focus, where the children will learn about where different foods come from and how food is produced. In P.E., our focus for the term will be creative dance, giving the children opportunities to explore movement, rhythm, and expression in a fun and active way.

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Numeracy

In Numeracy this term, our learning in Numeracy will focus on extending the children's understanding of number within the range 0-30. The children will practise counting forwards and backwards and develop their ability to identify numbers that come before, after, and in-between. We will continue to build on addition and subtraction skills through oral word problems and by recalling doubles to 10. Beyond number, the children will also explore length through a variety of practical, play-based learning opportunities.




Outdoor Learning
